

ACE Arts works with various communities and organizations to professionally provide fundamental art skills and materials to populations who may not otherwise have access to many artistic forms of expression. We then take the work created by groups of participants who are teamed up with local artists, into the public and present our inner selves through art in the public sector.

MURAL AT DEFREMERY POOL:

The large walls at the public pool of DeFremery Park are bare with the exception of a few mineral streaks that run down. Through working with the Oakland Aquatics Department, ACE Arts has developed an initial water/bay themed idea that must now be translated into an image and initial sketch. The image is educational, historical, environmental and visually inspirational. ACE Arts and Ralph J. Bunche High School will transfer the work onto the two large walls at the pool. The culmination of the work will result in a dedication and celebration of DeFremery, West Oakland and the Public Facility this celebration will coincide with OPR's 100th Anniversary. Without doubt the piece will entice and bring community out to the pool.



SUBJECT: Request from Kristi Holohan of K Design to paint a mural on the wall inside the pool area at deFremery Pool.

SUMMARY

The Office of Parks and Recreation (OPR) received a request from Kristi Holohan to paint a mural on the inside wall at deFremery Pool. The mural would depict the City of Oakland skyline, the unique architecture of West Oakland and deFremery Park and Pool and the bay and wetlands. Youth from Ralph Bunch High School adjacent to deFremery Pool would be engaged to assist with the mural as an arts education activity from design concept and planning to the painting and finishing.

FISAL IMPACT

There will be no fiscal impact on the Office of Parks and Recreation.

KEY ISSUES

OPR Aquatics is requesting approval from the Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission (PRAC) to move forward with the mural project. If approved, Staff and Kristi Holohan will meet with representatives from OPR and PWA to make sure the location is correct and that proper paints and sealers are used to minimize future maintenance and vandalism. Aquatics Coordinator Cody George and Pool Manager John Tornatore-Pili will monitor progress and manage the project to ensure it meets agreed upon parameters and that it is completed in a timely manner.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission approve the request from Kristi Holohan to paint a mural inside the deFremery Pool area.

BIO

KRISTI HOLOHAN was born in 1979 in a small rural town in Massachusetts. She received her BA from the University of Massachusetts Amherst in an independent major titled *Cross Cultural Studies of Dress & Gender* in which she was sponsored by Artist and African American studies professor Nelson Stevens (who participated in Africobra-Coalition of Black Revolutionary Artists). Stevens proved to positively influence her art in the direction of a message of social importance. By designing formal gowns for a small clientele Kristi was able to put herself through the University. While at UMASS, Kristi worked to initiate an artist collective called the Mothership and volunteered her free time at the Survival Shelter and with the City of Amherst's Department of Mental Health teaching visual art classes to institutionalized individuals with mental and physical disabilities.

Kristi has lived in Oakland for the past 6 years; the arts, progressive mindset and incredible diversity are the primary reasons for her residence in Oakland. The incredible city has captured her and she has laid her roots. In the recent year she has started Arts and Creative Expression (ACE Arts), fiscally sponsored by Friends of Oakland Parks and Recreation (FOPR). ACE Arts is an artist organization created to sustainably address social issues through the arts by teaching foundation techniques and providing materials to those who do not have access to art programs. As a central member and educator of ACE Arts, she is currently collaborating with numerous organizations in Oakland, which include the following: Peralta Neighborhood Community Group, various programs in Oakland Parks and Recreation, Rock Paper Scissors, Youth Uprising, and Intersection for the Arts, Ralph Bunche High School and College Park at Castlemont. Her work with the community can be seen in Nicol Park, Dimond Park, Irvington High School (in Fremont), other mobile pieces have been seen at Oakland Art Murrmur, Picnic in the Park, Art and Soul, and Sausal Creek Native Plant Sale.

Kristi's personal work includes illustrations in a recently published book Arlington's Dream (a children's book addressing homelessness, the book is first in a series), hand-bound books, formal evening and wedding dresses (created on commission for a small clientele), graphic design, public and private murals and canvass painting commissions. Her works are seen in California and around the United States. The work is primarily with recovered, recycled, and donated materials so as to create art from the found and with little capital. Her last show was endangered species stuffed animals created from recovered fabrics. The proceeds from the show went to (and are continuing to go to) endangered species programs at the Monterey Aquarium and other endangered species programs throughout the US.

Kristi's community work through ACE Arts has proved to have a deep impact on Oakland. She currently curates *Challenges of Champions*, which addresses the continuous plague of homicide and it's effects on the community and individuals in city of Oakland. This show is scheduled to show in Oakland for the year 2009. Kristi also currently sits on the board of FOPR. Her positive community work with a diverse population has inspired thought and action. She consistently works to harness the power of Oakland's vast community and create a knowledgeable, expressive, strong, safe and vibrant future for our city. In accordance with the City of Oakland Open Space Zoning Regulations, a minor conditional use permit is required for the addition of restrooms, picnic areas, separate play area and structure for 5 – 12 year olds, enclosed soccer practice court, hopscotch / four square play court, drop shot basketball hoop, community gardens, and entry plaza at 38th Avenue to be installed as a part of the park renovation project. Other improvements include replacing the existing play equipment and safety surface for 2 – 5 year olds, swings, basketball court, lighting, wooden deck with an accessible concrete deck / seating platform, pathway paving and benches. The plan included a turf play field, landscaping and irrigation systems will be renovated. Calvin Hoa from CEDA and Cheryl Miller spoke about the above renovations request.


