

CRITERIA FOR CASE SELECTION FOR EVIDENTIARY HEARING

The following criteria are used to select individual cases to be presented during an evidentiary hearing:

1. The CPRB Commissioners may select to have any case presented during an evidentiary hearing.
2. Upon completion of an investigation, if it is determined the evidence and testimony received is conclusive as to the facts which occurred (or did not occur) during an incident, either supporting or disproving the allegations made then the case can be administratively closed with a decision recommended by the investigator and the Executive Director. In such instances the cases are presented to the CPRB Commissioners for concurrence. The Commissioners will review the findings and render a final determination to either concur with the recommendation or not. If the Commissioners do not concur then they can offer an alternate resolution or refer the case for an evidentiary hearing.
3. Upon completion of an investigation, it may be that the evidence and testimony received is such that an evidentiary hearing would be the best way to reach a determination as to the facts which occurred (or did not occur), then the case may be referred for an evidentiary hearing. Further inquiry by the Commissioners would prove beneficial to reach a determination on the allegations made. The Executive Director will consult with the investigator and the Commissioners to decide if the case should be presented during an evidentiary hearing.
4. Any case which is considered high profile, or which has policy implications which could be substantial are selected for evidentiary hearing.
