III. INTRODUCTION – NEW BOARD MEMBER

Director Finnell reported that at the last council meeting José Dorado was confirmed by City Council. Mr. Dorado has yet to participate in the New Member Orientation but he was invited tonight since he was officially confirmed as a board member.

He was also Chair of the Measure Y Oversight Committee for several years. He is a member of various community groups. He has a small tax and bookkeeping business on Fruitvale Avenue. IV. MINUTES

A. September 22, 2016

VI. DIRECTOR'S REPORT

(Executive Director Anthony Finnell)

A. Announcements

Director Finnell asked members to review Attachment 3 in the Agenda Meeting Packet. He announced that he attended the NACOLE Annual Conference (September 25-29, 2016). He reported that he was a presenter at the conference. He was also elected to the Board of Directors for NACOLE (A two-year term). Board members applauded. He stated that he had his first board meeting yesterday, which was exciting. This puts CPRB in Oakland on the National map.

Chair Brown asked Director Finnell to speak regarding his Outreach presentation. Director Finnell reported that he was invited by Dr. William Hanson, J.D., Department Chair, Administration of Justice, Co-Director, Law & Democracy Program, Chabot College to speak on October 3, 2016 to a group on community policing and civilian oversight. One of the students present writes for the school newspaper so an article will be forthcoming; Director Finnell will share the article with Board members at a later date. [He met Dr. Hanson last year and he asked him to make a presentation to one of his classes, which he did earlier this year].

B. Pending Cases as of October 7, 2016

Director Finnell reported that as of October 13, 2016, there are 57 CPRB cases: 53 are active cases, 0 cases pending closure, 4 tolled cases, and there are no Evidentiary Hearings scheduled in the future. Since the last report was given on July 14, 2016, eleven new cases have been added. Commissioner Tevelson mentioned that the Pending Case List shows a number of Priority 1 cases; will those cases be coming to an Evidentiary Hearing? Director Finnell stated that at this time none of these cases will be set for an Evidentiary Hearing.

Commissioner Ball inquired as to Case No. 15-0655 being tolled. Director Finnell stated that it will be listed as a Tolled Case until it has been approved by the Board to be closed. The case will be further discussed in Closed Session.

## VII. CPRB SPECIAL COMMITTEE REPORTS

### A. Outreach Planning

#### 1. Report from Chair

Chair Brown asked Chair Tevelson to give a report. Chair Tevelson stated that he was on vacation and a meeting was not held. He reported that he spoke with Director Finnell today and he has not heard back from the school contact; Director Finnell will follow up with the school.
