# Fairfax Neighborhood Branding

## **Abstract:**

This project aims to create a holistic community vision through the incorporation of a variety of local modern businesses, residents, individuals, youth, churches, mosques and other groups to create a “branding” of the neighborhood with a focus on history, culture and modern community. Visually, the iconography will reflect historical signage, natural imagery, and typography once present in the neighborhood as well as inform and inspire the utilization (of existing) and recognition of historical landmarks provided by the research of 6<sup>th</sup> generation Oakland residents. Pending project approval, local young “writers” and community will be recruited and invited to study, practice, and learn about the historic signage for the “re-branding” of the historic Fairfax shopping district at a local business. Typography, writing, calligraphy, script and the personal “branding” often seen in what is considered vandalism is studied by and utilized in modern street aerosol work, thus creating a gateway into professional sign painting practices for community members who may be interested in expression through painting and not having a legal avenue.

## **Proposed Image:**

Because the work requires immense community feedback, there is not currently a proposed rendering. The work will be based on Historical Neighborhood signage.

## **Original TimeLine:**

- February
  - Recruit painting consultants/community members/volunteers for design development and research
  - Research Potential Images, Typography and Signage
  - Meet and Present for open Community open Session (date TBD) Fairfax community business feedback session about words and images
- March
  - Meet for Community Approval of adjusted images and discussion
- April
  - April 4<sup>th</sup>-April 30<sup>th</sup> (aligned with Oakland Unified School District’s spring break) paint images on assigned community space with the assistance of Oakland Youth pending weather.
- May
  - Community Dedication and visions of the future of the neighborhood

- NCPC presentation is tentatively scheduled for community participation in April (third Wednesday)
- Continued participant recruitment from the congregation, as well as other community members
- Research and Development throughout the May
- May distribution of project funding from the city (this is projected pending everything works in a timely way)

- June painting



**Designer/Partnership:**

Kristi Holohan, Artist, Youth and Community Director of Rock Paper Scissors Collective (a certified city vendor) will facilitate the design, and execution of the proposed work as well as maintain the lifespan of the Mural Work. Kristi will work with the Local Neighborhood Crime Prevention Council, the Congregation in the Fairfax Theater, Youth from the neighborhood, local businesses, congregations and Temples. Kristi was asked to participate from the NCPC.

**Maintenance:**

*Wall option 1* has a high cost for the rental of the lift. Pending ordinary circumstances, the life of the mural is expected to be 5-15 years. In the case that the mural needs restoration, additional funding would need to be raised to cover the costs of the lift. The benefit of the placement of the mural option is that there is little chance the mural will be vandalized because it is inaccessible.

**The Melrose-High Hopes Neighborhood Council initiated and supports the project to paint a mural on the upper west wall of the Fairfax Theater building. We have had numerous meetings with the owners and congregation of the Fairfax Deliverance Church and they support the project.**

In summer 2014, The Melrose-High Hopes Neighborhood Council grateful accepted City Council Member, Libby Schaff's offer of a grant for a mural to aid in the revitalization of the Fairfax/Bancroft/Foothill Commercial District.

Subsequently, the City Council approved funding-in-full for the mural proposal created in collaboration with the community and many of its members.

We believe that the mural, and the involvement of neighborhood residents and youth in the planning and painting of the mural, will discourage graffiti on the building and give the once-vibrant commercial area a renewed identity. It will support the ongoing effort to transform a neglected commercial area into an inviting community destination.

## MURAL AUTHORIZATION AGREEMENT

This Mural Authorization Agreement ("Agreement") is entered into effective 11/23/14, by and between Kristine Holohan (the "Artist") and ~~Fairfax Lighthouse~~ <sup>Community Church</sup> (the "Property Owner"); (the Artist and the Property Owner together constitute the "Parties").

The Artist wishes to create a public mural (the "Mural") on the South East exterior walls of the property at 5345 Foothill Blvd., Oakland, California (the "Premises").

The Property Owner owns and controls the Premises, and wishes to authorize the Artist to create the Mural.

Therefore, in consideration of the mutual obligations set forth herein, and intending to be legally bound, the Parties agree as follows:

1. Property Owner hereby authorizes the Artist to create the Mural.
  2. Property Owner hereby grants the Artist and its authorized agents scheduled access to and use of the Premises as necessary to create the Mural, including any access and use necessary for the erection and maintenance of scaffolding.
  3. Property Owner shall bear no responsibility for any bodily or personal injury to the Artist or Artist team occurring in the course of the creation, repair, alteration, restoration or removal of the Mural.
- The Property owner takes no responsibility for any unforeseen nature or condition of the premises that are unbeknownst to the property management team and or property owner in the area for which the mural be painted. The property owner ask the Fairfax Lighthouse Community Church be included in an insurance "Endorsement" as a certificate holder and be given a copy of said insurance.
4. The Artist shall bear no responsibility for any property damage to the Premises occurring in the course of the creation, repair, alteration, restoration or removal of the Mural, so long as the Artist takes reasonable care to avoid causing such damage.
  5. The Artist shall not interfere or block entrances and exits of any of the property owners existing tenants to said property, which would interfere with day to day operations.
  6. Upon the completion of the Mural, the Artist shall leave the Premises as it found it, except for the addition of the Mural and any improvements incidental to the creation of the Mural.
  7. The Artist shall monitor the condition of the completed Mural from time to time, and may repair, alter, restore or remove the Mural at the Artist's sole discretion and to the Artist' sole satisfaction. The Artist shall provide reasonable notice to Property Owner, and shall honor any reasonable request by Property Owner to delay or reschedule work, before re-entering the Premises for the purposes of repairing, altering, restoring or removing the Mural.

8. The Property Owner shall not repair, alter, restore or remove any portion of the Mural, except if (i) the Property Owner has determined that repair or removal of the Mural is necessary to eliminate an imminent threat of physical injury to persons or property, the Property Owner has notified the Artist of the situation, and the Artist has failed to remedy the situation within a reasonable period after receiving such notice, or (ii) the Property Owner has determined that the wall is to be removed or physically altered in such a way that the Mural cannot remain in place, the Property Owner has notified the Artist of the situation, and the Artist has failed to remove the Mural within 100 days of receiving such notice. The Artist shall bear reasonable costs of any work performed on or in connection with the Mural by the Property Owner pursuant to this paragraph. The property owner retains right to mural approval, aesthetic production of the work, and future development of the wall premises with above stated communication with the artist.

9. If either party shall desire or be required to give notice to the other, such notice shall be given in writing, via prepaid U.S. certified or registered postage address to recipient as follows:
