

SUBJECT: Pre-Booking/Post-Booking Clearance for Alameda County JJC

POLICY: The Medical Unit at the Alameda County Juvenile Justice Center will manage all minors booked in once they are deemed stable and cleared for incarceration. This includes minors who are intoxicated, injured, have chronic medical conditions, pregnancy, and acute illness.

Per Title 15 criteria, the term 'Fit for Incarceration' shall be consistent with the facility's ability to safely care for the minor in question. The JJC Medical Unit is essentially a primary care clinic with additional resources for the monitoring of acute, short term conditions. Minors who require immediate or STAT laboratory work, continuous monitoring by medical personnel for more than 23 hours or more frequently than every hour, EKG, ultrasound, etc. will have to be maintained at a tertiary care facility until they are stabilized for detention at the JJC.

JJC Medical Staff Contact Information: An RN is available 24 hours a day for questions; they will provide contact information for the NP/MD on call as needed

Medical Clinic: (510) 667-4931 Please ask to speak with the RN on duty.

Probation Intake: (510) 667-7450 (if no answer at Medical Clinic) Please ask to speak with the RN at Intake.

Chronic Illness: (diabetes, epilepsy, mental illness)

Every effort should be made to have the minor evaluated at his/her medical home, especially if they are noncompliant with treatment.

Pregnancy: females who are pregnant and have not seen an OB in the past 2 weeks should be cleared, preferably with an ultrasound for gestational age.

Injuries:

The injury must be stable and the minor must be able to perform self care, etc. as well as move around the living unit. *Crutches are not allowed in the facility.*

Infection:

Minors with infectious disease will be accepted provided the disease state is stable and the minor is not posing a health threat to other minors or staff.

Immune compromise:

Minors with immune compromise must be evaluated before putting them at risk by introducing them to the general population. Lab work documenting appropriate blood counts must be presented at intake. This includes minors with immune compromise due to illness, organ transplant, chemotherapy, etc.

Intoxication:

Any minor who displays signs of intoxication or is known to have ingested any substance that could result in a medical emergency must first be stabilized at an outside emergency room. If the emergency room provides treatment that requires intensive monitoring, the

minor must remain in the outside facility until he or she is stable. Marijuana intoxication does not require clearance.

Paperwork: It is crucial to the continuation of care that a progress note and all lab/imaging results as well as any prescriptions or treatment recommendations come with the youth to intake.
