

To assist you in finding the appropriate permitting information for your business, the CalGOLD database provides links and contact information that direct you to agencies that administer and issue business permits, licenses and registration requirements from all levels of government. Much of the information is specific to the type of business and its location in California.

3. Business Tax

Registers all Oakland businesses, consultants, contractors, home-based businesses and owners of rental property. Determination of need to pay Oakland Business Tax is responsibility of business owner.

4. Planning Approvals

Issues planning and zoning approvals and conditional use permits related to approval of alcohol sales. Zoning sign-off is required for each Business Tax registration, and conditional use permits are needed for some locations.

6. Building Permits & Inspections

Issues permits for construction of new buildings and renovation of existing buildings, and reviews construction to ensure it is proceeding according to the approved plans and conditions of approval. Depending on the type of business you are establishing, additional steps may be required. BAC staff can advise you. Specific permits are detailed on page 4.

The State of California issues liquor licenses, which are required for all businesses selling alcohol, and the City of Oakland issues conditional use permits for bars, restaurants, stores and other businesses selling alcohol as part of Zoning approval.

Incentives

Here are ways to lower your local, state and federal tax liabilities.

Business Tax Incentive

Waives City business tax payments for up to three years to businesses with 20 or more employees relocating into Oakland. For businesses in the City's key industries (see page 4), there is no employee minimum. Other eligibility requirements apply.

Sales Tax Incentive

Reimburses businesses with 20 or more employees up to 50% of the City portion of their sales tax for a maximum of three years.

Enterprise Zone

Helps businesses make use of credits on their state income tax for qualified employees' wages (potentially worth over \$30,000 per employee over five years) and sales or use tax paid on qualified equipment or machinery purchases (up to \$20 million available per business), and facilitates credits on a business's federal income tax for hiring an eligible job seeker (\$8,500 over two years). Portions of Berkeley and Emeryville are also located in the zone.


