Prepare now to pass your first inspection, and avoid a re-inspection fee.

HOW TO PROTECT YOUR HOME, FAMILY AND NEIGHBORS:

Create "defensible space" by removing overgrown weeds, tall grass and brush within 30 feet of your house, up to 100 feet may be required on steep lots! Trim back tree limbs, so that they are less than 10 feet above your roof.

WHY?

Defensible space acts as a buffer between a structure and an advancing fire.
