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### **Incoming City Administrator Appoints Executive Leadership Team**

*Oakland, CA* — Incoming City Administrator Sabrina Landreth today announced the appointment of the newest additions to her executive leadership team: **Christine Daniel** as Assistant City Administrator, and **Stephanie Hom** as Deputy City Administrator. Christine and Stephanie round out the executive team along with Assistant City Administrator Claudia Cappio, who began on April 27.

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“Christine and Stephanie are stellar professionals whose equitable and transparent approach demonstrates respect for staff and community stakeholders alike,” said incoming City Administrator **Sabrina Landreth**. “Both enjoy outstanding reputations for their dedication to delivering quality customer service and bringing creative solutions to the cities they serve.”

**Christine Daniel** has been City Manager of the City of Berkeley since November 2011. Prior to that, she served as Berkeley’s Deputy City Manager for four years, overseeing the Public Works, Housing and Community Services, Health Services, Human Resources and the City Clerk departments, as well as the Police Review Commission and the Code Enforcement unit within the City Manager’s Office.

Before returning to Berkeley in 2007, Christine served the City of Fremont for eight years in various capacities including Deputy City Manager, Deputy Director of Community Development, Senior Manager in the City Manager’s Office, and Deputy City Attorney. When she was appointed in 2004 as Fremont’s Deputy City Manager, she was the liaison to the Community Development Department on major land use projects, and the City Manager’s representative on the Budget Team. She also served as Acting City Clerk for a period of time, and oversaw special projects for the Redevelopment Agency, Parks & Recreation and Finance.

In a previous tenure with the City of Berkeley she served almost eight years as a Deputy City Attorney including assisting the City Manager’s office with the abatement of problem properties. Before that, Christine practiced with the law firm of Hardin, Cook, Loper, Engel & Bergez in Oakland representing a variety of public-sector clients.

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Christine received her bachelor's degree from Mills College and her law degree from U.C. Davis and is a 25-year resident of Oakland.

“I am honored to be joining the Oakland team,” she said. “I look forward to working in my home city and devoting my skills and experience to a place that I love.”

**Stephanie Hom** is a well-respected public administrator with more than 21 years of experience in local government. She has a demonstrated commitment to fiscal responsibility, responsiveness and transparency. Currently serving as the Administrative Services Director for the Town of Moraga, Stephanie implemented long-term financial sustainability solutions, including the city’s first five-year financial plan and comprehensive annual financial report, which received national recognition for two consecutive years. In Moraga, she transformed the community trust in financial management and also achieved a 50% General Fund Reserve.

Stephanie previously spent nearly 18 years in the City of Oakland where she is credited for broadening community engagement and access while managing the Public Works Agency Call Center and implementing new technologies such as SeeClickFix. Stephanie has also been effective in streamlining business processes, improving government effectiveness and efficiency, as well as community access to government.

Stephanie graduated cum laude from the University of California at San Diego and earned a Masters of Public Policy and Administration from Columbia University. She has lived in Oakland with her family since 1991.

“I love Oakland and I’m extremely honored and excited to be able to work for the Oakland community and alongside City of Oakland employees who work hard every day to help make Oakland better and brighter,” Stephanie said.

Incoming City Administrator Sabrina Landreth begins July 1. Deputy City Administrator Stephanie Hom starts on July 27, and Assistant City Administrator Christine Daniel starts on August 10.

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
