No earthquake injuries or damage reported in Oakland at this time

Oakland, CA — This morning at about 6:49 a.m., a 4.0 earthquake struck on the Hayward Fault, with an epicenter located between Lake Temescal and Mountain View Cemetery. The shaking was felt throughout Oakland.

At this time, no damage or injuries have been reported to the City of Oakland.

This seismic event serves as a reminder to all Oaklanders that we need to be prepared. California Governor's Office of Emergency Services (Cal OES) noted in a tweet this morning that about 5 to 10% of earthquakes in California are followed by a larger one within a week.

To help Oakland residents, neighborhood groups and businesses to prepare for disasters, the City of Oakland offers a free training program called CORE (Communities of Oakland Respond to Emergencies). CORE teaches self-reliance skills and helps neighborhoods establish response teams to take care of the neighborhood until professional emergency personnel arrive.
