Broadway Transit Circulator Study

The City of Oakland is conducting a Broadway Transit Circulator Study to evaluate the feasibility of extending the existing Broadway Shuttle route to Kaiser Hospital and MacArthur BART, and the potential for either a streetcar (on tracks) or enhanced bus service to improve transit efficiency and connectivity, and spur economic development on Broadway. The study area extends from Jack London Square to Kaiser Hospital and MacArthur BART.

Funded by the Federal Transit Administration through the Caltrans Transportation Planning Grant program, the study is also reviewing enhanced bus alternatives that would connect downtown to Brooklyn Basin and Jack London Square to the Rockridge BART station.
