As any other Oaklander, I am saddened and horrified by the fire. Giving that both friends of ours were lost and that I at one time lived in a similar (but not as dangerous) illegal artist warehouse here in Oakland long ago, I'd like to propose an idea.

I'd like to put together a small group of volunteer architects, builders, and engineers familiar with both Oakland's building / fire codes and it's unique culture to offer pro-bono consulting services to art spaces so as to help them get as legal as they can be.

A group where those running such spaces could safely reach out for help without fear of being outright reported, and a group where professionals such as myself could offer help with limited or eliminated liability.

We'd focus on the lowest hanging and affordable fruit of fire safety and exiting, while also generating a 'roadmap' for spaces to get fully legal, with rough costs to do so, so as to empower those within the spaces to really understand the issues at hand.

However, community organization isn't my wheelhouse, nor is politics or the obvious legal issues such a thing arises, and of course I'd like to be as sensitive as possible to all at this horrible time.

But I'd like to help, and help in a way that allows a hundred 'Crucibles' to bloom here in Oakland.

So to start with, is this something that you'd have time to talk more about at your convenience?

Thanks for your time, and thanks for fighting the good fight Libby, and being there for Oakland in this terrible year.



Attached are the permit and complaint history from the past 30 years from the City of Oakland's Planning and Building Department related to the warehouse at 1315 31st Avenue and the neighboring vacant lot on a separate parcel at 1305 31st Avenue.

This 30-year period roughly covers the length of time for which we have electronic records.

We have prioritized compiling the planning and building records related to the warehouse and the lot because the vast majority of questions from the public are related to the contact we have had through this city agency. We will be compiling public records from other city departments in the coming days.

It is important to note that there are several possible ways in which the City of Oakland primarily comes in contact with a property and the City's responsibilities vary based on the agency which has the encounter and the nature of the circumstances. For example, if a member of the public contacts the city to complain about building code safety violations, the complaint would be directed to the Building and Planning Department.

Once they are fully compiled, it is our intention to share public records from other agencies. Records will be posted to the City of Oakland website on a rolling basis at www.oaklandnet.com.

WHAT DID THE CITY OF OAKLAND'S DEPARTMENT OF PLANNING AND BUILDING KNOW ABOUT THE WAREHOUSE AND VACANT LOT AT 1315 and 1305 – 31ST AVENUE?

Who owns the warehouse?

According to public records the owner is listed as Chor N. Ng.

Who owns the lot?

According to public records the owner is listed as Chor N. Ng.

What is the permitted use of the warehouse at 1315 31st Avenue?

The only permitted use for the warehouse is as a commercial space. It was not permitted for residential nor public assembly use.

-MORE-

How many complaints have there been on the warehouse that was involved in the 31st Avenue Fire?

Prior to the deadly warehouse fire, there have been three complaints made about this address – two in 2014 and one in 2005. The complaints were:

- 1) on 10/8/14: constructing house/structure without permits,
- 2) on 9/30/14: Pallets, construction materials blocking the sidewalk; and
- 3) on 11/16/05: Vacant lot next to above address. Lot used as a parking lot and a homeless camping ground.

Currently, there are no open complaints on the property.

How many complaints have there been for the vacant lot adjacent to the warehouse – 1305 – 31st Ave?

There are 18 records related to the lot at 1305 31st Ave prior to the warehouse fire. Seven of these records are complaints involving the lot beginning in 1988. There are no visible street addresses for either the warehouse or the vacant lot and their adjacency may have caused complainant confusion. The following two complaints were made on the vacant lot during 2016:

- 1) On 11/14/16: illegal interior building structure;
- 2) On 11/13/16: "There are a ton of garbage piling up on the property on 1305 – 31st Ave. Also, a lot of items are left on the sidewalk near the property. Some of trash was hazardous. This property is a storage but the owner turned it to become trash recycle site. The yard became a trash collection site and the main building was remodel for residential. The change causes our neighborhood looks very bad and creates health issue."



Last night the decision was made to remove the parapet; several removal methods were tried before they resorted to removal and they brought in cadaver dogs (by crane lift) to ensure there were no victims remaining before that step was taken. Site remains 90% cleared.

Transgender names have been addressed per the family's wishes. We've been advised to NOT use "aka" but rather to recognize legal name accompanied by "living her life known as ..." Beginning to plan for Family Center demobilization and ongoing services. Can serve as an ongoing link to services. It will be open until the search is completed. 30 families have been notified; 5 are in process of notification; 1 remains a scientific investigation. AICo will demobilize mobile command tomorrow.

PWA/PD – beginning to demobilize command site; bringing debris/evidence to new secured location. DA determined that debris/evidence in the first storage location does NOT need to be relocated before rain comes as was already wet from firefighting efforts. All debris in first location has been double checked by cadaver dogs. Debris in second location will get second check by cadaver dogs, in process. We need to confer with DA regarding how long the remaining structure needs to remain in place, as it would be unsafe to leave it in place long term.

ATF – Origin and cause of fire has not been determined yet. No new information.

PIO – wrap up press conference at site will be 5:45. Chief Reed – declaration of local emergency & ops status. Congresswoman Lee. Sherriff will update victim status and family notifications. Mayor will release inspection records and cue up tomorrow's announcement of the work ahead. Next press conference will be at Downtown EOC sometime tomorrow. No more on-site press conferences.

Demobilization meeting 8pm tonight.
