### INFORMATION

Following are the key activities to be highlighted this week:

***Violence Reduction Plan Preliminarily Showing Positive Results in West Oakland*** - The Oakland Police Department's current violence reduction plan, in support of the 100-block initiative, is showing preliminary, positive results in West Oakland (comprised of police beats one through seven). As indicated in the chart below, implementation of the violence reduction plan, which began on January 17, has demonstrated initial reductions of felony crimes in West Oakland after comparing key felonies from the first four weeks into the implementation of the plan to the following four weeks.

***Appointment of Whitney Barazoto as the Public Ethics Commission Executive Director***— Whitney Barazoto has been selected as the Public Ethics Commission Executive Director, with a start date effective April 23. The Public Ethics Commission Executive Director is responsible for directing and coordinating administrative and managerial services to the Public Ethics Commission and represents the Commission in meetings before elected officials, City staff, the

public and other city and state bodies. Ms. Barazoto has a variety of experience in the public sector in the local and state levels of government, including work with the County of Contra Costa, the California State Legislature and the Fair Political Practices Commission. ***Oakland Receives \$6 Million from State for Park Improvements*** - The State of California awarded \$6 million from a Proposition 84 Statewide Parks Grant to the City of Oakland for improvements to Durant Mini Park and Golden Gate Recreation Center Expansion and Park. The City of Oakland competed against 400 applicants for \$184 million in Prop 84 funding for this year. \$5 million will be used at Golden Gate Recreation Center and Park at 1075 62<sup>nd</sup> Street in North Oakland. The project involves an additional 9,700 square feet for a new multipurpose gym, new performance stage/activity room, new teen lounge, new community living room/art gallery, new walking track, new school-age playground and new outdoor performance area. This project will dramatically improve existing recreational opportunities, including modernizing and expanding the kitchen, relocating a dedicated computer room, and reconfiguring the existing multi-purpose room. The remaining \$1 million dollars in grant funds will be used for improvements at Durant Mini Park, at 29<sup>th</sup> Street and MLK, Jr. Way. The improvements will include improved lighting for safety on the plaza, a new amphitheater and picnic areas, a new community garden, a new children's play area and tot lot, and a new walking circuit and bicycle accommodations. ***Public Safety Advisory Street Robberies*** - The Oakland Police Department would like to make the public aware that during the past several days a series of street robberies have occurred in the downtown area. Police have received information that the two robbery suspects are described as riding bicycles when they approach their victims and commit the robbery. The robberies have occurred in the downtown area on the following date, times and locations:

- March 20, at 5:00 p.m. in the 2000 block of Telegraph Avenue;
- March 20, at 9:10 p.m. in the 900 block of Clay Street;
- March 23, at 1:00 a.m. in the 600 block of 9th Street; and,
- March 23, at 11:50 a.m. in the 900 block of Oak Street.

Both suspects are described as African-American males, approximately 18-21 years of age, 5'8" to 5'9", 140 to 150 pounds, wearing black jackets and dark jeans. There have been no reports of weapons used in these incidents. Police need your help in identifying these suspects. ***Measure Y Street Outreach Team Training*** – On March 22, Chicago CeaseFire Technical Assistance providers visited Oakland to provide training for the City's Measure Y Street Outreach Teams. The teams learned how to improve their conflict mediation techniques and how to formulate a game plan for the street outreach target areas. This training was made possible by a two year grant of \$2.2 million that was awarded to the City's Department of Human Services in 2010. 
