INFORMATION

Following are the key activities to be highlighted this week:

Occupy Oakland Update – A total of 13 Occupy Oakland protesters arrested on January 28 have been arraigned on criminal charges. The Alameda County District Attorney's Office charged the 13 defendants with criminal offenses and the presiding judges issued stay away orders from Frank H. Ogawa Plaza and/or Henry J. Kaiser Convention Center. Of the 13 charged, nine protesters were charged with misdemeanor offenses, and four were charged with violent felony offenses. The Oakland Police Department will continue to work with the District Attorney's Office on the filing of criminal charges. On February 4, Oakland Police facilitated a march of approximately 100 people through the streets of downtown Oakland between 9:00 p.m. and 11:00 p.m. Although social media sites had indicated that individuals or groups planned a "militant, radical march," and asked peaceful bystanders to not interfere with criminal tactics, the march was peaceful overall. The Oakland Police Department received no reports of violence, arson, vandalism or injury to protesters or police. In addition, no arrests were made. The only reported incident came in the early evening, when approximately 10 protesters wearing masks at Frank H. Ogawa Plaza threw several large bottles of suspected urine at the media. On February 6, a separate but related rally occurred at Frank H. Ogawa Plaza with several marches to the County Courthouse located at 7th Street and Washington Street. At this rally, approximately 100 persons peacefully participated and there were no resulting arrests or reported incidents. For more information, please contact Sgt. Oakland Fire Department Awarded Grant for SCBA Equipment - On February 3, the Oakland Fire Department (OFD) received notification that it had been awarded an Assistant to Firefighters Grant (AFG) in the amount of \$471,249 to be used to upgrade and/or replace outdated Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBA). Combined with the required City of Oakland matching funds of \$117,812, funds available for new SCBA equipment totals \$589,061. While current SCBA units meet the 1997 National Fire Protection Administration (NFPA) standard, the grant funds will allow the OFD to upgrade all 213 OFD SCBA units to the most

Department of Human Services Releases Measure Y RFP - On February 9, the Department of Human Services released the Measure Y 2012-15 Request for Proposals (RFP). Nearly \$5 million is available to fund violence prevention and intervention strategies aimed at reducing violence in Oakland, especially among youth and young adults most likely to be perpetrators or victims of gun violence. There are four primary strategies: Comprehensive Youth Services, Reentry Employment, Family Violence and Street Outreach/Crisis Response. Nonprofit organizations and public agencies are eligible to apply through the RFP process. Interested parties are strongly encouraged to attend the Bidders' Conference on February 16. Faced with critically low Firefighter Paramedic staffing levels, OFD hopes this recruitment will help it meet the minimum staffing requirements for Advanced Life Support (ALS) and medical-related emergency services. Announcing the Search for the City of Oakland's First-Ever Youth Poet Laureate - By May 15, candidates must submit their literary works to be considered for the City of Oakland's first-ever Youth Poet Laureate. As a project of the Teen Services Division of Oakland Public Library, the search for Oakland's Youth Poet Laureate is being conducted in collaboration with the renowned arts organization Youth Speaks. The talented young writer selected through this search will serve as an ambassador for literacy, arts and youth expression, while inspiring his or her peers and publicly representing our city. Judges, including renowned authors, artists and civic leaders, will narrow the field to 10 finalists, who will be announced in July. After a second round of interviews and judging, the City of Oakland's first Youth Poet Laureate will be announced in early October. The winning poet will earn an educational scholarship and embark on a year of public service and academic enrichment coordinated by a committee of community partners. Public Works Agency Launches Mobile App Tool for Citizens to Report Problems - On February 8, Mayor Jean Quan unveiled the Public Works Agency's portal into the mobile app called SeeClickFix for reporting non-emergency problems such as illegal dumping, graffiti, broken street lights and other infrastructure issues to help keep Oakland clean and safe. All of the data goes into the City's existing Public Works system. The SeeClickFix mobile app joins phone,

email and web as another tool the community can use to report a problem. Information from all these sources is funneled into one database for tracking and resolution. SeeClickFix allows residents to quickly report and track non-emergency community issues ranging from potholes to graffiti. Smartphone users can use GPS to enter the address of a problem and take a photo. Oakland Public Works crews benefit by having the photo clearly document the area of concern. With increasingly limited resources, Oakland Public Works crews cannot be everywhere. SeeClickFix is designed to facilitate civic conversation and engage the community in improving Oakland's infrastructure. Bus Rapid Transit Environmental Document Released - On February 3, AC Transit and the Federal Transit Administration released the Final Environmental Impact Statement/Report on the East Bay Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) Project. The project, which will be funded by federal, state and local funds, is a rapid bus line that would travel from San Leandro through Oakland along International Boulevard, and then through downtown Oakland and along Telegraph Avenue to the Berkeley border. The line would have permanent station stops installed along the way, and run much faster than the existing system. AC Transit is hosting a series of community meetings to provide the public with an opportunity to comment on the project. Following the close of a 45-day public comment period that began on February 3, the Bus Rapid Transit project FEIS/R will be proposed for certification by the AC Transit Board. At that point, the Oakland City Council will deliberate on adopting all or a portion of the Bus Rapid Transit Project for Oakland. Lake Merritt Boating Center Purchases Three New Sailboats - On February 3, the Lake Merritt Boating Center received three brand new Catalina 14.2 keelboats just in time for summer Sailing Classes. The cost of the three boats was \$26,944 and was paid for with boating safety grant funds from the California Department of Boating and Waterways. These new boats will enhance the sailing experience of an estimated 500 youth and 70 adult students who enroll in Learn-to-Sail classes and approximately 365 rental customers annually. WHY THIS NOTICE?

The Alameda-Contra Costa Transit District (AC Transit) proposes to implement the East Bay Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) Project, a 14.38-mile

BRT line connecting Berkeley, Oakland, and San Leandro. AC Transit and Federal Transit Administration (FTA) have released a Final Environmental Impact Statement/Report (FEIS/R) on the proposed East Bay BRT for public review and comment. AC Transit is hosting a series of community meetings to provide the public with an opportunity to learn more about the project and comment on the FEIS/R.

The proposed project intends to significantly improve the speed, reliability and quality of public transportation service in the Berkeley-Oakland-San Leandro corridor.

WHAT IS BUS RAPID TRANSIT?

Bus Rapid Transit, or BRT, combines the best features of rail with the flexibility and cost advantages of bus transit. BRT features could include the following:

- Dedicated bus lanes
- Transit signal priority
- Service operating at 5-minute intervals during peak and midday periods
- Stations typically spaced 0.2 to 0.4 miles apart
- Stations with level-boarding platforms, shelter, seating, security cameras, and real-time bus arrival information
- Pre-paid ticketing
- Low-floor, multi-door, low-emission vehicles
- Buses with doors on both sides




