Following are the key activities to be highlighted this week:

Short-Term Strategies, Long-Term Solutions: Improving Public Safety in Oakland – In March and April, Mayor Jean Quan and the City of Oakland are hosting a series of town hall meetings seeking input from neighborhoods across the city on public safety priorities. This input will be incorporated into two action plans currently being developed by Strategic Policy Partnership for the Oakland Police Department (OPD): 1) a short-term strategy to have an immediate, high impact on crime trends and 2) a long-term, citywide strategy to sustain reduced levels of crime. Strategic Policy Partnership is a consulting team of the nation's best minds in policing, with proven track records in achieving major reductions in crime. These town hall meetings will be structured to foster active, engaging dialogue between the consulting team, City leaders and the Oakland community. Meetings will be attended by Mayor Jean Quan, City Administrator Deanna J. Santana, City Councilmembers, Police Chief Howard Jordan and members of the OPD Command Staff. New Oakland Housing Assistance Center Launched – On Wednesday, February 20, a new one-stop housing services center was launched. Located on the 6th floor of the Dalziel Building at 250 Frank H. Ogawa Plaza, the Center seeks to streamline City housing services and improve access to housing-related information and services for Oakland residents and businesses. This includes homeowners in foreclosure, tenants needing legal services and new landlords trying to understand local requirements. The City is also partnering with other public and private agencies to improve access to additional housing resources and services for Oaklanders. By redeploying existing Housing and Community Development resources in one place, the Center will provide all current Housing and Community Development direct services (rent adjustment, residential lending and housing rehabilitation, first time homebuyers' programs), as well as new foreclosure prevention and mitigation programs funded by the City (the ROOT loan fund program and foreclosure prevention housing services by the Community Housing Development Corporation). A trained intake specialist will provide guided referrals to non-City provided housing resources including tenant and landlord legal services, Section 8 programs, affordable housing opportunities, housing rehabilitation assistance, County programs for healthy housing resources, energy-efficient improvements and energy bill assistance, emergency and transitional housing, and homelessness prevention services. Trained intake specialists will help conduct research and provide matching resources. Staff will engage in follow-up work with residents who come to the Center in order to track the delivery of services and maintain data on outcomes.
