City Offices Closed On Veterans Day – On Wednesday, November 11, the City of Oakland's administrative offices will be closed in observance of the Veterans Day holiday. Police, fire and emergency services are not affected during the holiday. Please note that normal parking enforcement throughout the City for all violations will occur on Wednesday, November 11. Bank On Oakland 2.0 Luncheon – On Friday, October 30, Mayor Libby Schaaf, the Alameda County-Oakland Community Action Partnership (AC-OCAP) and Bank on Oakland hosted a luncheon at City Hall to announce the re-launch of Bank on Oakland 2.0. The luncheon was attended by financial institutions including Western Federal Credit Union, Bank of America, Citibank, JP Morgan Chase, Bank of the West, Benefits State Bank and the Community Bank of the Bay. Joining the financial institutions were the Bank on Oakland Executive Committee, Mayor and City staff and members of the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC). Unbanked residents in Oakland are paying enormous fees for the most basic financial services at check cashing centers and payday lenders. In 2013 alone, Alternative financial service providers, like payday lenders, gouged American households underserved by mainstream financial institutions with fees in the amount of \$103 billion. Since 2008, the City of Oakland has been working with its financial partners to reach thousands of unbanked residents, however, there are still too many Oakland residents without bank accounts. Bank on Oakland 2.0 plans to continue to work with unbanked residents and support them in budgeting, building credit and saving for the future. Homegrown Officer Wants To Give Back – On Friday, October 30, the 35 members of the 172nd Basic Academy were sworn in as Oakland Police officers. Eight of the new officers are Oakland residents, including Officer Alexis Mejia, 29, who has lived in East Oakland since he was 3 years old. When he was growing up, Mejia was impressed by police officers who visited his school and talked to him and the other children. He vividly remembers when officers visited his apartment building, giving all the kids high-fives and Junior Police Officer stickers. Years later, those experiences from his childhood are still fresh. Knowing the power that positive

policing can have, his goal is to give back to the community he grew up in. He hopes to have the same positive effect on young people that OPD officers had on him when he was young. Oakland's Active Transportation Projects Win \$9.1 Million In Grants – On Thursday, November 5, the Oakland Public Works Department announced that it recently won two grants totaling over \$9.1 million from the State of California's Active Transportation Program (ATP). These projects will improve walking and bicycling connections for Oakland residents and visitors. The 19th Street BART to Lake Merritt Urban Greenway Project was awarded \$4.6 million by the California Transportation Commission. This project will give pedestrians and bicyclists renewed priority along 20th Street in the heart of Uptown, calm auto traffic on the 1950's-era streets, and firmly connect BART and AC Transit lines to the City's crown jewel, Lake Merritt. Altogether, this project will complement the City's \$198 million Measure DD investment in enhancing Lake Merritt as a city-wide attraction. The Telegraph Avenue Complete Streets Project was awarded \$4.5 million by the Metropolitan Transportation Commission. The project, located along the key blocks between 20th Street and 41st Street near the MacArthur BART Station, will make Telegraph Avenue safer for pedestrians, bicyclists and transit users. The project will install cycle tracks, and add and improve the safety of pedestrian crossings and transit boarding islands to enhance the street. Police Arrest Car Thief Involved In Stealing Car Stereos – On Monday, November 2, at around 1:20 p.m., an Oakland Police sergeant saw a suspicious vehicle with two occupants in the area of Hegenberger Road and Edgewater Drive. As the sergeant radioed in his observation, the vehicle took off at a high rate of speed and fled the area. A short time later, the same vehicle was involved in a rear-end accident with another vehicle at a stoplight. The driver and passenger ran from the scene. The passenger was able to evade police detection, but the driver was detained by the sergeant and officers. A preliminary investigation revealed that the vehicle was stolen and

that both the driver and passenger had been involved in stealing car stereos. Medical attention was called for the driver of the rear-ended vehicle and the driver of the stolen vehicle; both appeared to have minor injuries. The driver was arrested for being in possession of a stolen vehicle and stolen property, and for the hit-and-run accident. Minimum Wage Increase – Effective Friday, January 1, 2016, Oakland's Minimum Wage goes up to \$12.55 per hour. Measure FF, the voter-initiative ballot measure passed in November 2014,

provides annual increases to Oakland's Minimum Wage based on the Consumer Price Index for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers (CPI-W). In light of the increase, employers must be aware of the following:

- By Tuesday, December 15, 2015, employers are required to provide notice to employees and prominently display posters on the new Minimum Wage;
- On Friday, January 1, 2016, the rate goes up 30¢ to \$12.55; and
- The other benefits mandated by Measure FF – paid sick leave and payment of service charges – remain the same as when the employment law took effect on March 2, 2015
