***Rockridge Branch Library To Close Temporarily For Repairs*** – On Saturday, April 23, the Oakland Public Library's Rockridge Branch, at 5366 College Avenue, will close temporarily for repairs. The branch library is scheduled to reopen on Wednesday, July 6. The work includes interior painting, carpet replacement and some light fixture replacement. The work is funded by the Mello-Roos special tax district paid by Rockridge area property owners. Once Rockridge Branch closes, the due date for any materials checked out from the branch will automatically be extended to mid-July. Patrons do not need to return Rockridge materials during the closure period. However, the Rockridge book drops will remain open during the closure and returned items will be checked in on a regular basis. If patrons have items on hold with Rockridge Branch designated as the pick-up location, the location will automatically change to the Temescal Branch Library at 5205 Telegraph Avenue. **Neighborhood Works With OPD To Solve Burglary Streak** – On Monday, April 11, Oakland police officers made a key arrest involving a suspect who was connected to multiple home burglaries over a several-day time span. After the investigator reviewed the cases, the beat officer re-contacted victims and witnesses and gathered additional video footage. As it turned out, the suspect was already wanted on a \$50,000 warrant for burglary and assault. The combination of high technology camera footage, neighbors sharing information with each other and the police and old-fashioned beat work resulted in a good arrest. **Latham Square Construction Update** – On Thursday, June 30, the City of Oakland anticipates substantial completion of the Latham Square project. "Substantial Completion" means that the majority of the site sidewalks, plaza area, crosswalks and vehicular travel lanes should be open to the public. Please keep in mind that these are approximate dates and are weather dependent. The intersection at Telegraph Avenue and 16th Street was recently reopened, and vehicles can once again travel along 16th Street from Telegraph Avenue. There is, however, ongoing construction at the corner of 15th Street and Broadway and the corner of 17th Street and Telegraph Avenue to install new sidewalk curb extensions, access ramps and traffic signals. These improvements will be installed around late May, into early June. Installation of a landscaped median on Broadway between 15th Street and 17th Street will begin in late April and early May. Please remember the

surrounding local businesses are open during construction and are always accessible by foot. While you are there, abide by the posted signs and use the designated paths and crosswalks. ***Earthquake Upgrade Construction On BART Elevated Structures*** – In March, as part of their system-wide Earthquake Safety Program, strengthening work began on BART's elevated structures in East Oakland, spanning from 18th Avenue to 75th Avenue. The work includes adding steel and concrete to foundations, and protecting utilities and equipment. General work hours are 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., Monday through Friday with limited night and emergency work as needed. For safety reasons, installation of temporary k-rail and safety shields for BART track ways may be performed at night. This work will happen intermittently throughout the duration of construction. If lighting is required at night, special care will be taken to ensure that lights are directed at the work areas and away from residences. During the project, the public can expect temporary shifting of traffic lanes, and temporary sidewalk and lane closures, as well as temporary reduction of available street parking. The public can also expect the relocation of traffic signals, lighting and pedestrian signage. BART will attempt to minimize construction-related noise, dust and inconvenience. ***Public Input Sought On Local Hazard Prioritization*** – In April, the City of Oakland will host two additional community meeting where Oakland residents and business owners are invited to share their priorities on reducing the effects of natural hazards and risks. Every five years, FEMA requires local governments to update their Local Hazard Mitigation Plan (LHMP). The City of Oakland is currently updating its LHMP for the years 2016-2021. The LHMP will identify projects that could potentially reduce risks in the community from natural hazards and is designed to reduce the loss of life and property. To be most effective, a Hazard Mitigation Plan is prepared before a disaster occurs by identifying the hazards a community faces, assessing vulnerabilities to the hazards and identifying specific actions that can be taken to reduce the risk.
