Following are the key activities to be highlighted this week:

***New Parks & Recreation Director Appointment Announced*** – On Thursday, May 21, City Administrator Sabrina Landreth announced the appointment of Mr. Nicholas Williams as our new Oakland Parks & Recreation Director. For the past three years, Nicholas – an Oakland native – has served as the Assistant Superintendent of Recreation at Minneapolis Parks and Recreation, known as having one of the top park systems in the country. He has been responsible for 49 year-round, neighborhood-based recreation centers that offer hundreds of recreation, education and interpretive programs for youth, adults and seniors in the Minneapolis area. He is dedicated to improving quality of life for the entire community through community engagement and partnerships in the preservation and expansion of recreational facilities and programs. Prior to Minneapolis, Nicholas had an impressive career managing park and recreation operations in the City of Atlanta for over five years. Nicholas fills the vacancy left by Ms. Audree Jones Taylor who retired in December 2015, and will start work as the new director on Monday, June 6, 2016. ***22nd Annual Oakland Earth Day*** – On Saturday April 23, Oakland will hold its largest annual volunteer cleanup and beautification event, Oakland Earth Day. About 3,000 volunteers are anticipated to help clean and green at over 80 locations in parks, creeks and streets throughout Oakland during the 22nd Annual Oakland Earth Day. Approximately 60 sites are in parks or along creeks and other waterways, and about 20 sites will be neighborhood cleanups of streets, sidewalks and schools. Volunteers will pick up litter, remove graffiti, weed, plant and restore native plant habitat. Oakland Public Works sponsors this event, with support from the Alameda County Flood Control and Water Conservation District, and participation from more than 60 community groups including Friends of Sausal Creek, Keep Oakland Beautiful and the Lake Merritt Institute. Last year, more than 3,400 volunteers pitched in over 15,000 hours at 90 sites across Oakland. They removed 170 cubic yards of trash and 500 cubic yards of weeds and green waste – enough to fill more than 4,000 household garbage carts. This year, volunteers will be working at approximately 100 Oakland sites. Join us to clean and green Oakland's parks, creeks and streets. ***City To Celebrate National Small Business Week With Workshops, Visit By SBA Administrator*** – From Sunday, May 1 to Saturday, May 7, the City of Oakland will celebrate National Small Business Week (NSBW) by hosting more than a dozen workshops and events for local small business owners and entrepreneurs. Small businesses are the engine of Oakland's economy – 90% of local firms employ 20 or fewer people. While many of Oakland's small businesses are startups and young companies, others are long-established firms. Across all industry sectors, small businesses are helping to fuel Oakland's economic growth and are an important factor in our city's diversified economy. From workshops on access to capital and digital marketing to sessions on small business 101 for artists and diversity in entrepreneurship, NSBW participants can learn skills to start and grow their businesses in Oakland. Several receptions are planned throughout the week including Monday's opening reception to recognize five family-owned and -operated Oakland companies that have been in business for more than 25 years and Tuesday night's recognition at the Oakland City Council meeting honoring one small business from each Councilmember's district. U.S. Small Business Administration Administrator Maria Contreras-Sweet will close her national tour in Oakland on Friday, May 6, with a tour of Revolution Foods. Following the tour, she will join Congresswoman Barbara Lee and Mayor Libby Schaaf at a reception highlighting Oakland's Food Manufacturing sector. During the reception, Revolution Foods will be honored for their efforts to transform the way America eats by providing access to healthy, affordable meals. Oakland-based Nona Lim Company will be recognized by Contreras-Sweet as Northern California's Emerging Business of the Year for 2016. Oakland residents are encouraged to join in the celebration by taking part in the Kiva Oakland Pledge Drive on Sunday to crowdsource 0% interest loans that will enable hundreds of Oakland's small businesses to grow and thrive or during Saturday's Shop Local - Shop Oakland activities in shopping districts throughout Oakland. ***Latham Square Construction Update*** – On Thursday, June 30, the City of Oakland anticipates substantial completion of the Latham Square project. "Substantial completion" means that the majority of the site sidewalks, plaza area, crosswalks and vehicular travel lanes should be open to the public. Please keep in mind that these are approximate dates and are weather dependent. The intersection at Telegraph Avenue and 16th Street was recently reopened, and vehicles can once again travel along 16th Street from Telegraph Avenue. There is, however, ongoing construction at the corner of 15th Street and Broadway and the corner of 17th Street and Telegraph Avenue to install new sidewalk curb extensions, access ramps and traffic signals. These improvements will be installed around late May, into early June. Installation of a landscaped median on Broadway between 15th Street and 17th Street will begin in late April and early May. Please remember the surrounding local businesses are open during construction and are always accessible by foot. ***CPRB Conference Draws National Audience*** – On Thursday, April 7, the Citizens' Police Review Board (CPRB) held a conference titled, "Profiling: Developing a Mechanism to Identify, Quantify and Investigate Profiling Allegations Against Police." More than 50 people were in attendance from all over the Bay Area, and from as far away as Indiana and Florida. The conference was live streamed over the Internet, courtesy of the National Association for Oversight of Law Enforcement (NACOLE), and drew viewers on the East Coast and Midwest. Several leaders of oversight agencies from around the Bay Area were also in attendance. A panel of community leaders discussed what the Oakland Police Department (OPD) is currently doing to address the issue of profiling, how data is currently being used in law enforcement, how it is used when reviewing citizen complaints, the challenges and how we can use open-data to serve our communities better, as well as how implicit bias impacts us all in everyday decision making. The panelists included Assistant Chief Paul Figueroa from the Oakland Police Department (OPD), Social Science scholars Dr. Jack Glaser and Nick Camp, and San Jose's Independent Auditor Walter Katz. There were discussions on how difficult it is to prove profiling allegations. There were also discussions regarding the steps law enforcement and oversight agencies can take to make officers more aware of the impact their actions have on the community. The attendees learned from Assistant Chief Figueroa of OPD's commitment to understanding how unconscious or implicit bias affects policing and how the department is teaming up with experts and agencies nationally to learn how to improve their systems to better support the citizenry. Oversight practitioners left the conference with a better understanding of what needs to be done in order to be proactive in addressing profiling in law enforcement. NACOLE was the event co-sponsor with the CPRB. Through this partnership, we were able to bring together the practitioners of the Bay Area with law enforcement and residents to

***OPD Arrests Armed Robbery Suspects*** – On Tuesday, April 19, at about 10:00 p.m., Oakland Police officers responded to a report of an armed robbery in the 5700 block of Bancroft Avenue. The victims reported that three suspects had walked up to them and robbed them at gunpoint. Two of the suspects were armed. Officers canvassed the area and located two men who matched witness descriptions. The suspects fled on foot; after a perimeter was set, one suspect was located and arrested. Investigators continue working to identify and locate the other suspects involved. On Sunday, April 17, at about 7:26 p.m., Oakland Police officers responded to the 600 block of Valle Vista Avenue on a report of a shooting. Officers met with the victim, who had been robbed at gunpoint. During the robbery, one of the suspects had discharged a firearm, not injuring the victim or anyone else. The two suspects fled the scene in a vehicle. Officers located the suspect vehicle in the 800 block of Peralta Street a short time later, conducted a vehicle stop, arrested the two suspects and recovered the victim's loss. ***Rockridge Branch Library To Close Temporarily For Repairs*** – On Saturday, April 23, the Oakland Public Library's Rockridge Branch, at 5366 College Avenue, will close temporarily for repairs. ***Public Input Sought On Local Hazard Prioritization*** – On Monday, April 25, the City of Oakland will host the last in a series of community meeting where Oakland residents and business owners are invited to share their priorities on reducing the effects of natural hazards and risks. The meeting will be held at the West Oakland Senior Center, 1724 Adeline Street. Every five years, FEMA requires local governments to update their Local Hazard Mitigation Plan (LHMP). The City of Oakland is currently updating its LHMP for the years 2016-2021. The LHMP will identify projects that could potentially reduce risks in the community from natural hazards and is designed to reduce the loss of life and property. To be most effective, a Hazard Mitigation Plan is prepared before a disaster occurs by identifying the hazards a community faces, assessing vulnerabilities to the hazards and identifying specific actions that can be taken to reduce the risk. The 2016-2021 LHMP will describe the natural hazards and risks, identify the top priorities for addressing each hazard and detail the work being done now and work expected to be done over the next five years. Once the plan is adopted by the Oakland City Council, the City of Oakland can

prioritize projects and continue to be eligible to obtain FEMA pre- and post-disaster grants. The plan will also make Oakland a more disaster-resistant and resilient community.
