Following are the key activities to be highlighted this week:

Oakland, The Country's Most Diverse Large City – On Wednesday, May 11, WalletHub released its latest findings on diversity among 313 of the largest cities across the United States. This study combined household diversity with social class diversity, ethno-racial diversity and economic diversity. Oakland took the top spot as the most diverse among large cities with a population of 300,000 or more. Among all cities, Oakland ranked No. 1 for Most Racial & Ethnic Diversity. City Awarded \$4 Million in Federal Funding To Alleviate Homelessness – On Thursday, May 12, Oakland Mayor Libby Schaaf and City of Oakland Human Services Director Sara Bedford announced that the City has secured over \$4 million in federal grant funding to provide immediate housing and support for homeless youth, families and adults. On May 2, the U.S. Department of Housing & Urban Development (HUD) announced the renewal of all five of the City's current grants and the addition of a new grant to the Community Housing Services Division (CHS) of the City of Oakland's Human Services Department. The new grant will fund a homeless youth rapid rehousing project. Totaling \$4,839,673, these six grants support the North County Homeless Youth Rapid Rehousing program, Housing Fast Support Network program, Families in Transition program, Matilda Cleveland program, Oakland Homeless Youth Housing Collaborative and the North County Family Rapid Rehousing Collaborative. Homelessness in Oakland and the Bay Area is a significant problem, and has been more apparent given the upward pressure on rents during the past two years. The number of homeless people in Oakland as of the most recent 2015 count is approximately 2,190. On any given night, there are an estimated 1,384 people in Oakland who are unsheltered. With approximately 350 shelter beds plus 60 beds during the winter months, a majority of homeless peoples are unable to find shelter. State Assemblymember Honors Oakland Public Works – On Thursday, May 12, California District 18 Assemblymember Rob Bonta presented the Oakland Public Works Department with a proclamation in recognition of its successful implementation of new roadway safety treatments, including new bike lanes on Grand Avenue. This work is innovative and sets the stage for the future of Oakland streets. The Grand Avenue Road Diet project included re-striping the lanes of travel from two vehicle lanes in each direction to one in each direction, with a center left-turn lane, improved crosswalks for pedestrians and new buffered bike lanes in both directions. The cities of Oakland and Piedmont celebrated the completion of the Grand Avenue roadway improvement projects running from Greenbank Avenue in Piedmont to Mandana Boulevard in Oakland. New Mobile Food Vending Regulations Being Considered – On Wednesday, June 1, the Oakland Planning Commission will consider a proposal by the Planning Bureau to establish a new citywide food vending permit program that would replace existing food vending programs. The new program would permit, with certain restrictions, individual food vending on private property and from the public streets and sidewalks in selected commercial and industrial areas. Embarcadero Bridge Closure And Traffic Detour – On Friday, May 13, the Embarcadero Bridge was closed for the long-planned replacement project by the Oakland Public Works Department. The project is expected to take two years, with the new bridge scheduled to open in May 2018. The bridge spans the Lake Merritt Channel where it joins the Oakland-Alameda Estuary. The new bridge will be seismically safer and will include enhanced pedestrian and bicycle access. It will also be higher than the existing bridge, so paddlers in kayaks and canoes will be able to go under. During construction, the Embarcadero, between Estuary Park and 5th Avenue, will be closed, and through traffic will be detoured to the 7th Street Bridge. The seismic safety of our infrastructure is critical for Oakland residents and visitors. We thank all bridge and roadway users for their patience and cooperation as this needed work is done to improve our infrastructure's ability to withstand earthquakes. Annual Vegetation Management Inspections To Begin – On Wednesday, May 18, the Oakland Fire Department (OFD) will begin Annual Vegetation Inspections. Inspection notices have been sent out to the owners and occupants of properties in the Very High Fire Hazard Areas of the Oakland Hills. Persons who either own property or live in these areas are reminded that while mandatory inspections occur once per year, properties must remain in compliance year round. Residents can reduce community wildfire risk and achieve compliance with Oakland's regulations by installing wildfire resistant landscaping and creating at least 30 feet of defensible space around the home by clearing dead weeds and vegetation. A failure to comply not only increases the wildfire risk for neighboring properties and occupants, but also will result in a minimum \$303 fine to the property owner. There are several resources – such as free extra yard trimming pick up from Waste Management and free chipping of small tree limbs and brush – that residents and property owners in the Very High Fire Hazard Areas may want to use to help them achieve and maintain compliance with Oakland Fire regulations.
