City Of Oakland To Host GO-Biz Regional Workshop on 'California Competes' Tax Credit – On Wednesday, July 20, the Governor's Office of Business and Economic Development (GO-Biz) will host a workshop on the California Competes Tax Credit. Small, medium and large businesses are encouraged to attend the workshop and receive instruction on how to apply for this new state tax credit program. The workshop runs from 1:00 to 2:30 p.m. in Hearing Room 1, Oakland City Hall, 1 Frank H. Ogawa Plaza. The California Competes Tax Credit Program has approximately \$243 million in tax credits available during the 2016-17 fiscal year for businesses that want to expand in, or relocate to, California. The next application period begins Monday, July 25 and closes Monday, August 22. The program sets aside 25% of the annual allocation to small businesses.
