Following are the key activities to be highlighted this week:

***Warriors Parade And Rally*** – On Thursday, June 15, the City of Oakland and the Golden State Warriors hosted a parade and rally to celebrate the 2017 NBA Champions. Initial estimates indicate one million fans from around the Bay Area attended the festivities. Today's events proceeded without any major incidents. As of 4 p.m., the Oakland Fire Department had responded 105 calls for medical assistance, predominately for heat-related issues. Street closures began at 6 a.m. this morning and the parade stepped off shortly after 10 a.m. from Broadway at 11th Street. The parade proceeded north up Broadway before turning right on Grand Avenue, then right on Harrison, left on to 19th Street, then right onto Oak Street before ending outside the Henry J. Kaiser Convention Center and along Lake Merritt Boulevard for the rally. The rally began shortly before 1 p.m., where Mayor Schaaf and fellow elected officials from around the region joined Golden State Warriors owners, leadership, and players on the rally stage. After making brief remarks, the Mayor presented Warriors owners Peter Gruber and Joe Lacob with the "Key to the City of Oakland." Oakland Public Works moved quickly to clean and clear the streets and rally following the parade. Most streets were reopened to vehicle traffic by 4:30 p.m. As of 4 p.m., a total of three arrests were made; two for public intoxication and one for assault on an officer. During the parade and rally, 11 minors were missing. All have been reunified with their parents or guardians. As of 3 p.m., BART reported 301,270 exits. That is a 45% increase from a typical Thursday and very similar to ridership during the 2015 championship parade and rally. Thirteen outside agencies worked alongside the Oakland Police Department to ensure the safe and seamless execution of today's events. ***City Encourages Oakland Residents To Apply For Measure LL Police Commission*** – On Wednesday, May 31, Mayor Libby Schaaf and the Selection Panel for the Police Commission announced the opening of the application process for the Measure LL Police Commissioners. Establishing and maintaining public trust and confidence in the Police Department is essential for the Department to be able to provide the highest level of service to the community. The Selection Panel will seek to make appointments that reflect Oaklanders' diversity of experiences, especially

individuals from communities experiencing the most frequent contact with the Department. Strong commitment to police accountability and public service will be prioritized. Duties include overseeing the Community Police Review Agency, which will conduct investigations into allegations of officer misconduct; propose changes to, approve or reject current or proposed Department policies; remove the Chief of Police for cause; as well as other duties. Commissioners must meet two criteria: 1) Be a resident of the City of Oakland and 2) Be over the age of 18 by date of first Commission meeting. The Selection Panel strongly encourages formerly incarcerated individuals to apply. Measure LL prohibits these categories of people from serving: current sworn police officers; current City employees; former Department sworn employees and current or former employee, official or representative of an employee association representing sworn police officers. ***Oakland Fire Department Is Preparing A Plan To Reduce Wildfire Risk*** – On Thursday, June 29, the Oakland Fire Department (OFD) will host a meeting to discuss the preparation of a Vegetation Management Plan (Plan) and Environmental Impact Report (EIR) that will describe how the City will monitor and maintain vegetation on more than 1,400 acres of City-owned lands and along approximately 300 miles of roadway to reduce the risk of destructive wildfires. Project staff will be available to provide a summary of the community survey responses received in March and April 2017, and to provide an update on Plan development, methodologies and work completed and underway. The meeting will be held from 5:30 to 7:30 p.m. at the Richard C. Trudeau Center, 11500 Skyline Boulevard. OFD encourages your involvement in this process. ***Resilient by Design Launches Bay Area Challenge With Open Call For Community Ideas*** – On Wednesday, May 31, Resilient by Design | Bay Area Challenge, an innovative new approach to prepare the Bay Area for the effects of climate change, launched with an open call for community leaders, local elected officials, national experts and residents to come together and address this critical issue before disaster strikes. The project, which will develop ten creative, implementable and long-lasting infrastructure solutions, will serve as a blueprint to flip the switch on traditional disaster rebuilding by addressing climate change before a storm or earthquake strikes and creates billions of dollars of damage and displaces our most vulnerable communities. The Rockefeller Foundation has funded this effort through a \$4.6 million grant, providing the necessary support to create and scale a model of the successful New York Rebuild by Design program which was pioneered by the Foundation in partnership with the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. In this unique collaborative approach, Design Teams will research and work in communities with local experts for eight months to offer ten creative solutions that can be adapted throughout the Bay Area and around the world. These ten solutions will be designed to protect shoreline communities throughout the Bay Area from increasingly severe storms and flooding that disproportionately impacts economically and socially vulnerable communities, and will tackle disparities in housing, health, transportation and the economy. During the Launch Phase this summer, the challenge will kick off with an open call for community members to suggest sites where action and investment could create community resilience. The Request for Qualifications for Resilient by Design is now available at [www.resilientbayarea.org](http://www.resilientbayarea.org) and Design Team applications are due by July 7. Once ten Design Teams are selected in August, the challenge will consist of two phases. During the Collaborative Research Phase, teams will participate in a three-month exploratory research and community engagement period to develop initial design concepts based on research and community input. During the Collaborative Design Phase, Design Teams will engage in a five-month intensive design process working in partnership with residents, businesses, community-based organizations and political leaders to develop detailed, replicable and implementable infrastructure projects. At the end of the challenge, an internationally renowned jury will judge ten final designs based on the potential for future successful implementation, adaptation to the future effects of climate change and benefits that address current issues such as public access to recreation areas, access to housing and protection of vulnerable infrastructure and transportation systems. ***No BART Train Service Between Lake Merritt And Fruitvale Stations*** – On Saturday, July 1 and Sunday, July 2, BART crews will be rebuilding the trackway between Lake Merritt and Fruitvale stations as part of the "Better BART" efforts. When the closure occurs, no trains will run between those stations and Lake Merritt station will be closed. Free buses will be available to move riders around the closure.
