1 in 4 children (26%) live in poverty in Oakland



1 in 7 children (14%) live in poverty in Alameda County

12% of Alameda County's residents (173,156) live below the federal poverty level

20% of Oakland's residents (75,285) live below the federal poverty level

8% of the surrounding Alameda County's (excluding Oakland & Berkeley) residents (79,277) live below the federal poverty level

COMMUNITY IMPACT

27,573 low-income Alameda County residents have been served by AC-OCAP.

100 low-income Oakland residents started a business, pursued higher education, or purchased a home through the Families Building Wealth IDA Program.

16,000 bank accounts have been opened through the City's Bank on Oakland Initiative for individuals who were previously unbanked.

\$23 mil in tax refunds has been brought back to low-wage earners through the Alameda County-wide EITC Coalition.

20,000 low-income residents were served at 60 sites as part of the EITC Campaign.

\$2.9mil saved by low-income families in tax preparation fees.

\$826,000 invested into the community and over **\$4.4 million** has been leveraged by non-profit partners.
