

WILDFIRES CAN OCCUR ANYTIME

Let's Work Together To Assure Your Property & Loved Ones Are Fire Safe!

Below Is What the Fire Department & Your Wildfire Prevention District Suggest You And Your Neighbors Should Do Each Month For Fire Safety & Protection:

JANUARY

- Begin chipping
- Start pulling broom & pampas grass seedlings
- Plan your fire safe landscaping

FEBRUARY

- Continue pruning & chipping brush
 - Review your structure's exposure to embers
- Free chipping service 238-7388

MARCH

- Pull thistles & flowering broom
 - Prune trees
- WPD begins roadside clearing & goat grazing

APRIL

- Clear under decks, stairs, porches, eaves, overhangs & around windows
 - Clear debris from gutters & vents
 - Screen vents with mesh
- Earth Day

MAY

- Clear weeds & grasses cut to 6" or less
- Attach exterior hoses

JUNE

- Cut or remove limbs from trees to at least 6' from the ground
 - Clear hazardous vegetation from around your property
 - Prune & chip shrubs
- Free chipping service 238-7388

JULY

- Clear any remaining flammable materials from around your property
 - Prevent fires from cigarettes, BBQ's or vehicle catalytic converters
 - Cut trees & large shrubs minimum 6' from the ground
 - Chip cuttings from limbs & shrubs
- Free chipping service 238-7388

AUGUST

- Remove dead & extra plant litter from your property
- Avoid weed eaters with metal blades due to risk of fire caused by sparks

SEPTEMBER

- Clean roof & gutters of debris
 - Keep defensible space watered
- Creek To Bay Day - 3rd Saturday

OCTOBER

- Close windows when you leave your house on Red Flag Days
 - Inspect & clean chimney & fireplace
- Fire Storm Anniversary:
October 21, 1991

NOVEMBER

- Plan fire safe landscaping
- Planting season begins
- Complete unfinished tasks

DECEMBER

- Make sure Christmas trees are watered
 - Inspect your chimney. Spark arresters are required for all chimneys in Oakland.
- Enjoy happy & safe holidays!

FREE Curbside Tree & Brush Chipping Service To prevent and reduce fire hazards in the Oakland hills

Homeowners and vacant lot owners in the Oakland Wildfire Prevention District may schedule free tree & brush chipping services by:

- Calling in advance to schedule your free service
- Leaving branches no greater than 4 inches in diameter
- Stacking branches in piles that are 4' x 4'
