IN REMEMBRANCE - Officer Ramon Irizarry #OaklandPolice

Officer Ramon Irizarry was assigned to Vice Division as an undercover officer. On January 11, 1983, while he was on duty with other Vice officers serving a search warrant at 1717 Peralta Street, a car pulled up in front of the house and the driver began honking the horn. Officer Irizarry approached the driver of the car and identified himself as a police officer.

The driver pulled a gun and shot at Officer Irizarry, striking him in the head. The suspect then drove off and was apprehended some distance from the scene of the shooting.

Officer Irizarry was transported to Providence Hospital where he was placed on life support systems. With the concurrence of the family, these were removed and Officer Irizarry passed away at 11:49 A.M., January 18, 1983.

A member of the Oakland Police Department since February 1981, Officer Irizarry was survived by his wife and child.

OPD Officers Make Car Stop, Recover Assault Weapon – On Wednesday, January 20, 2016 at about 6:23 PM, Oakland Police officers elected to conduct a traffic stop related to a vehicle code violation. During the preliminary investigation, officers discovered an illegal assault rifle. The driver was arrested at the scene. Officers additionally recovered multiple rounds of ammunition.

OPD Arrests 3 for Burglary – On Thursday, January 21, 2016, just after 12:00 PM, Oakland Police officers responded to a residential burglary in the 400 block of Thompson Avenue. When the officers arrived on scene, they were able to locate three suspects, who were arrested in connection with the residential burglary. Additionally, the vehicle the suspects were driving had been reported stolen. Investigators are looking into the possibility that these suspects may be connected to other crimes.
