

## Information Concerning the Derrick Jones Incident

*December 17, 2010*

On November 8, 2010, at 9:40 p.m., Oakland police officers were flagged down concerning a domestic violence situation between a man and a woman in the 5800 block of Bancroft Avenue. As the officers began a preliminary investigation into the situation, they located Derrick Jones, who was believed to be involved in the disturbance. Derrick Jones fled from officers during the course of their contact with him and was located after a brief foot chase in the 5800 block of Trask Avenue. The two officers discharged their weapons, shooting and killing Derrick Jones. Jones was not in possession of a weapon but had a metal scale at the time.

- In line with departmental policy, the two officers involved in the shooting (Officers Eriberto Perez-Angeles and Omar Daza-Quiroz) were placed on administrative leave immediately after the incident occurred; both officers will be placed in an administrative capacity while the investigations are conducted.
- Three investigations are currently being done: the Oakland Police Department's Homicide Division and Internal Affairs Division are both probing into the facts of the case, as is the Alameda County District Attorney's Office.
- In response to public concern and to ensure impartiality, Chief Batts has invited the Federal Bureau of Investigation to also conduct an independent review of the shooting. The FBI has responded to this request and the Oakland Police Department will provide them complete access to anything they may need to conduct their investigation.
- The Oakland Police Department is committed to ensuring that a fair, honest, and non-biased investigation of this incident is diligently carried out, and will provide updates as they become available.
