Oakland Police Locate Weapon Believed to Be Used In Oikos University Shooting

Oakland, CA — Oakland Police confirm that a weapon found early this morning matches the serial number of a gun purchased by One Goh, who was recently charged in the fatal shooting of seven people at Oikos University on Monday. “Investigators have worked very hard on this case. Hopefully, this find will help the families find closure and bring this case to justice,” said Police Chief Howard Jordan.

On Friday, April 6th at approximately 5:30am, officers located a gun in a waterway in the 8400 block of Leet Street. Further investigation and testing is needed to confirm if it was used in the incident.

This is an ongoing investigation and no additional details are available at this time. We will update you as information becomes available. Anyone with information is asked to contact the Major Crimes Unit at 510-238-3821.

Background

Oakland, CA - On Monday, April 2, 2012, seven people suffered fatal gunshot wounds, and three others were wounded in a shooting at Oikos University, located at 7850 Edgewater Drive, Oakland, Ca.

On April 4th, One Goh was formally charged by the DA’s office with seven counts of murder with special circumstances, and three counts of attempted murder.
