

Police Seek Community Help in Unsolved Homicides

Oakland, CA – The Oakland Police Department is requesting the public's assistance in solving the homicides of Lee Weathersby, Lamar Broussard and Derrick Harris.

On December 31, 2013, at 9:26 p.m., 13-year-old Lee Weathersby was murdered in the 1400 block of 104th Avenue. On January 19th, 2014, at 2:15 p.m., Derrick Harris and Lamar Broussard were murdered in the 10000 block of Longfellow Avenue. Weathersby and Broussard were brothers. The suspect vehicle is a Silver Dodge Durango (Shown Below).

Investigators have provided a photo of the victims and are requesting help from anyone who may have:

- Seen victim Weathersby III in the 1400 block of 104th Avenue on the evening of the shooting (December 31, 2013) prior to 9:26 p.m.
- Seen victims Broussard and Harris in the area of 100th Avenue and Longfellow Avenue on the day of the shooting (January 19, 2014) prior to 2:15 p.m.
- Witnessed the shootings.
- Seen suspect(s) fleeing the scene after the shooting.
- Has any information on the suspect vehicle pictured above (Silver Dodge Durango).

Oakland Police and Crime Stoppers of Oakland are offering a reward of up to \$30,000 for information leading to arrests in these cases.
