THANKSGIVING FOOD PROJECT / MEALS DELIVERED – On Monday, November 23, 2015, OPD's Chief Sean Whent, Police Services Technician II MaryAnn Mitchell, and Golden State Warrior Jason Thompson delivered meal packages to homes in an east Oakland neighborhood, as part of the Thanksgiving Food Project. #OaklandPolice

The Thanksgiving Food Project is an annual volunteer effort created and coordinated by Ms. Mitchell to provide turkeys and bags of food to less-fortunate families during the holidays. Ms. Mitchell has organized the Thanksgiving Food Project for the past 25 years along with the efforts of her family, and volunteers from the Evangelistic Outreach Association (Green Pastures Church). This project has relied on donations from police officers, employees of the Oakland Police Department and the community. Additionally, Safeway has generously provided 100 turkeys each year for the past 10 years.

This year, Jason Thompson (The Jason Thompson Foundation) joined in on the project and surprised Ms. Mitchell with a \$5,000 check and took part in the delivery of the packages.



The Oakland Police Department's School Safety Unit is hosting multiple Youth Open Houses to high school students in Oakland. NIGHT CLUB CLOSED DOWN - On November 6, 2015, agents with the California Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC) and officers from the Oakland Police Department (OPD) culminated an undercover investigation and executed a search warrant at an unlicensed underground nightclub located at 361 12th Street in Oakland. Agents arrested the business operators and seized alcoholic beverages, money and illegal drugs during the operation.

Both ABC and OPD had received citizen complaints of illegal alcohol sales, loud music and illegal drug use taking place at the location, known as "Studio 361", often until the early morning hours. On previous dates, agents entered the basement club undercover and confirmed that the illegal activity was taking place. In addition to a full cash bar, the club offered a disc jockey, a dance floor and several smoking rooms for its patrons.

Two club operators present on November 6th were arrested for selling alcohol without a license and for possessing cocaine. Agents seized 72 bottles of liquor, a significant amount of beer and wine, and approximately \$400 in cash from behind the bar. Agents also found several small bags of suspected narcotics believed to have been abandoned by patrons as agents and officers entered the business.

The investigation revealed that advertisement for the club took place primarily through social media and that it largely catered to patrons of licensed bars in the area after those businesses stopped serving alcohol at 2 a.m. as required by law.
