On Tuesday, March 15, officers from the OPD Area 4 Community Resource Unit, led by Sgt. Mega Lee, teamed up with Mr. Luis Ortega to feed the homeless and day laborers along the Hegenberger corridor and other areas in East Oakland where they knew there was a need. Mr. Ortega, Community Liaison to Oakland City Council Member Noel Gallo, reached out to In-N-Out Burger and FoodMaxx and obtained a generous donation of 20 double-doubled cheeseburgers and bottled water. ARRESTED & CHARGED - OPD arrest suspects in two separate murder cases and DA Charges. #OaklandPolice

On Monday, March 14, 2016, the Oakland Police Department arrested Darius M. Esters, 21, of Oakland for the August 8, 2012 murder of Tattiaunn Turner in Oakland. Esters was already in custody on a weapons charge.

On March 16, the Alameda County District Attorney's Office arraigned Esters for murder.

Background: On August 8, 2012, Oakland Police officers responded to the 2700 block of Talbot Avenue to investigate reports of gunshots fired. They located 16-year-old Tattiaunn Turner and another victim suffering from apparent gunshot wounds. Turner was pronounced deceased at the scene.

In a second case, on Monday, March 14, 2016 the Oakland Police Department arrested Leonard C. Jones, 33, of Oakland for the April 24, 2013 murder of Donitra Henderson in Oakland. Following leads generated by a November 2015 press conference, Jones was already in custody related to several crimes from another city.

On March 15, the Alameda County District Attorney's Office arraigned Jones for murder.

Background: On April 24, 2013, Oakland police officers responded to the 600 block of 54th Street to investigate reports of gunshots fired. Officers located 21-year-old Donitra Henderson, of San Leandro, suffering from apparent gunshot wounds. First aid/CPR was provided until emergency medical personnel arrived. Henderson was pronounced deceased at the scene.



BODY WORN CAMERAS & VICTIMS' RIGHTS - Assistant Chief Figueroa Co-Facilitates National Body-Worn Camera/Victims' Rights Forum in Washington, D.C. #OaklandPolice

On Tuesday, February 22, Oakland Police Assistant Chief Paul Figueroa flew to Washington, D.C. to co-facilitate a two-day national forum focused on a specific aspect of body worn cameras, hosted by the International Association of Chiefs of Police.

National leaders for victims' rights and law enforcement leaders came together to discuss best practices and areas for improvement as body worn camera use becomes more prevalent. The goal is to begin developing law enforcement policies and practices for body worn camera usage that take victims' rights into consideration.
