





ARRESTED & CHARGED - Oakland neighborhood works with Oakland Police Department to solve burglary streak.

On Monday, April 11, Oakland police officers made a key arrest involving a suspect who was connected to multiple home burglaries over a several-day time span. After the investigator reviewed the cases, the beat officer re-contacted victims and witnesses and gathered additional video footage. The suspect was identified Justin Joseph Holbert, 27, of Oakland. Additionally officers learned he had was wanted on a \$50,000 warrant for burglary and assault. Within hours, patrol officers were able to locate and make the arrest. The combination of high technology camera footage, neighbors sharing information with each other, and working together in partnership with the police, a serial burglar was taken off the streets.

On April 13, 2016, the Alameda County District Attorney's Office Charged Holbert with (3) counts of burglary; one count a violent felony and another count an auto-theft.

OPD RECRUITING & BACKGROUND UNIT IS SEEKING - The Oakland Police Department's Cadet Program is hiring ambitious young men and women who are committed to becoming law enforcement professionals in the City of Oakland. #OaklandPolice

Cadets are hourly employees who receive training and practical work experience in various aspects of the police profession.

Cadets are rotated through a variety of assignments designed to develop their interest in police work. Assignments may include traffic, recruiting, training, investigations, community service, and other support areas.

Intensive supervision, counseling, training, and evaluation by trained police officers begin the process of preparing Cadets for leadership roles and careers in law enforcement.

Cadets are required to participate in physical training exercises as a condition of their employment.

Cadets may work up to 19.5 hours per week. Duty schedules are dependent upon Department needs and school commitments.

Qualifications:

Must be at least 17.5 but no older than 20.5 at the time of appointment.

Must be a senior in high school or attending college. Must possess a valid unrestricted California driver's license. Must have no felony convictions.
