



OPD on the Beat – January – November 2016

January 2016

OPD Officers Quickly Locate and Arrest Bank Robbers – On Monday, January 25, 2016 at approximately 10:00 AM, Oakland Police officers responded to a call regarding a bank robbery at the Wells Fargo Bank located in the 3300 block of Lakeshore Avenue.

Witnesses were able to provide descriptions of the suspects and the suspect vehicle. At approximately 10:24 AM, OPD officers who were canvassing nearby located the suspect vehicle, conducted an investigative stop, and arrested two male adult Oakland residents for the robbery. This investigation is ongoing and anyone with information is asked to contact the investigators at (510) 238-3426.

OPD Officers Make Car Stop, Recover Assault Weapon – On Wednesday, January 20, 2016 at about 6:23 PM, Oakland Police officers elected to conduct a traffic stop related to a vehicle code violation. During the preliminary investigation, officers discovered an illegal assault rifle. The driver was arrested at the scene. Officers additionally recovered multiple rounds of ammunition.

OPD Arrests 3 for Burglary – On Thursday, January 21, 2016, just after 12:00 PM, Oakland Police officers responded to a residential burglary in the 4700 block of Tompkins Avenue. When the officers arrived on scene, they were able to locate three suspects, who were arrested in connection with the residential burglary. Additionally, the vehicle the suspects were driving had been reported stolen. Investigators are looking into the possibility that these suspects may be connected to other crimes.

Oakland Officers Arrest Suspected Identity Thieves – On January 2, 2016, 9:20PM, OPD officers conducted a traffic enforcement stop for a vehicle code violation. During their investigation they discovered multiple stolen credit cards, checks, gift cards, and personal documents. Both occupants of the vehicle were arrested at the scene. February 2016

Strong Arm Robberies – On Friday, February 19, at about 5:38 p.m., a woman was robbed of her cell phone in the 600 block of 23rd Street. Officers located and arrested the suspect in the 2200 block of San Pablo Avenue. The stolen phone was recovered. On Sunday, February 21, at about 2:55 p.m., a woman was robbed in the 2000 block of Broadway. The preliminary investigation led officers to the 3400 block of International Boulevard, where they were able to locate and arrest the suspect and recover the loss.

Armed Carjacking – On Sunday, February 21, at about 12:18 a.m., an armed carjacking occurred in the 2300 block of Grande Vista Place. OPD officers quickly located the car in the area of East 22nd Street and Mitchell Street and arrested the carjacking suspect.

Firearm Taken Off Oakland Streets – On Sunday, February 21, at about 11:30 p.m., an Oakland Police officer saw a vehicle parked in the 3000 block of E. 9th Street that had been reported stolen. The occupant was arrested for possession of stolen property and illegal possession of a loaded firearm, which was recovered from the vehicle.

Oakland Police and U.S. Marshals Make Arrests, Alameda County DA Charges Suspects In Two February Homicides

- On February 11 at about 11:10 a.m., Albert Easley, 35, was fatally shot and a 26-year-old man was wounded in a drive-by shooting in the 1000 block of 24th Street in West Oakland. Investigators subsequently identified Daniel Casey, 32, of Oakland, as the suspect in the case. U.S. Marshals arrested Casey in East Oakland on February 17, and on February 19 he was charged with murder and attempted murder in the case by the Alameda County District Attorney's Office.
- In a second case, on February 16, Oaklander Randy Escalante, 21, surrendered to Oakland police for shooting two men, one fatally, in the 500 block of Catron Drive in East Oakland, which occurred on February 15 at about 3:38 p.m. Victim Jonathan Sanchez, 23, of Oakland, was killed and the second man, 22, was wounded. On February 18, the Alameda County District Attorney's Office charged Escalante with murder and assault with a semi-automatic firearm.

March 2016

Police Confiscate Illegal Firearm, Make Arrest – On Sunday, March 20, at about 1:00 a.m., Oakland Police officers responded to call of a person with a firearm in the 10400 block of MacArthur Boulevard. Witnesses directed the officers to a loaded, high-capacity-magazine, illegally owned firearm under a vehicle; they also identified the suspect, whom the officers arrested.

Two Suspects Arrested for Kidnap and Robbery – On Monday, March 21, at about 5:10 p.m., Oakland Police officers were flagged down in the 8600 block of International Boulevard by a woman who stated that she had just been robbed by three males (two juveniles and an adult), who were standing nearby. The woman told the officers that the three suspects had dragged her and then taken her purse. Two suspects were arrested for robbery and kidnapping, and the third, a juvenile, fled on foot. The loss was recovered.

Firearm Recovered in Traffic Stop, Driver Arrested – On Tuesday, March 22, at about 5:00 p.m., Oakland Police officers conducted a traffic stop in the 7800 block of Ash Street on a vehicle in connection with a shooting that had occurred earlier in the day. The officers recovered a firearm from the vehicle and arrested the driver.

Police Make Arrest in Attempted Home Invasion Robbery – On Sunday, March 6, 2016, at 11:15 PM, an attempted home invasion robbery occurred in the 2600 block of 14th Avenue. Two male adults forced their way into a residence and demanded money. The victim was able to flee and flag down an Oakland Police officer. One of the suspects fled on foot in an unknown direction. The other suspect, an adult Bay Point resident, was detained, identified by the victim as one of his assailants, and arrested.

Robber Returns to Scene of the Crime and Is Arrested – On Sunday, March 6, 2016, Oakland Police officers responded to a caller in the 1900 block of Castro Street who reported that the person who had assaulted and robbed him in February was currently inside his apartment building. The officers were able to locate and detain the suspect, an adult Oakland resident, and placed him under arrest for assault with a deadly weapon and robbery.

OPD Arrests Two for Illegal Possession of Firearms – On Sunday, March 6, 2016, at about 10:40 PM, Oakland police officers responded to the 6400 block of Telegraph Avenue to investigate a report of subjects armed with firearms and creating a disturbance. When the officers located the suspect vehicle, they were able to recover two illegally possessed firearms and placed the two adult male suspects under arrest.

April 2016

OPD Traffic Stop Results in Gun Arrest – On Friday, April 29, 2016 at 6:05 AM, Oakland Police officers conducted a traffic vehicle stop in the 4200 block of Suter Street. Upon contact, the officers observed a firearm inside the vehicle. They recovered the loaded firearm. The driver was arrested for illegal possession of a firearm.

Carjacked Vehicle Located; Three Arrested - On Thursday, April 28, 2016 at about 5:50 PM, Crime Reduction Team 6 officers spotted a vehicle that had been carjacked two days earlier. Officers attempted to stop the vehicle, but it fled. With the assistance of the police helicopter, they were able to locate the car in the 2900 block of Capp Street, where they arrested the driver and two passengers and recovered the vehicle.

Felony Assault Arrest – On Wednesday, April 27, 2016 at about 8:00 PM, Oakland Police officers on patrol heard shots fired in the 6900 block of International Boulevard and observed two men struggling together. The suspect had a firearm and was aiming it at the other man, who had been shot. The suspect fled the scene and discarded his firearm. Officers located him a short time later and arrested him for felony assault. The firearm was recovered and the victim was transported to a local hospital in stable condition.

OPD Arrests Armed Robbery Suspects – On Tuesday, April 19, at about 10:00 p.m., Oakland Police officers responded to a report of an armed robbery in the 5700 block of Bancroft Avenue. The victims reported that three suspects had walked up to them and robbed them at gunpoint. Two of the suspects were armed. Officers canvassed the area and located two men who matched witness descriptions. The suspects fled on foot; after a perimeter was set, one suspect was located and arrested. Investigators continue the investigation to identify and locate other suspects involved.

Robbers Arrested - On Sunday, April 17, at about 7:26 p.m., Oakland Police officers responded to the 600 block of Valle Vista Avenue on a report of a shooting. Officers met with the victim, who had been robbed at gunpoint. During the robbery, one of the suspects had discharged a firearm, not injuring the victim or anyone else. The two suspects fled the scene in a vehicle. Officers located the suspect vehicle in the 800 block

of Peralta Street a short time later, conducted a vehicle stop, arrested the two suspects, and recovered the victim's loss.

Dispatcher Appreciation Luncheon 2016 – On Friday, April 15, Oakland Police Department Communications Division dispatchers and operators were guests of honor at a special luncheon held in appreciation for their service to the community and the Department. As National Dispatcher Appreciation week drew to a close, Police Chief Sean Whent and Bureau of Services Deputy Chief Danielle Outlaw expressed their gratitude for the excellent service provided by the Communications Division. Thanks to the men and women who serve as public safety telecommunicators for their hard work and dedication.

Oakland Police Department Helps Department of Justice Nab An Escapee – On Thursday, April 14, the Oakland Police Department assisted the Department of Justice apprehend a wanted man who had fled to Oakland from the state of Oregon. Thanks to help from Kaiser the K9, OPD patrol officers and DOJ officers were able to locate the wanted escapee in the general region surrounding Holy Names College. The suspect was serving time for armed robbery and assault on a police officer.

OPD Makes Robbery Arrest – On Tuesday, April 12, at about 12:30 a.m., Oakland Police officers responded to the 8100 block of International Boulevard on a report of a robbery. Officers located the suspect vehicle and arrested an Oakland man in connection with the robbery.

Shooter Arrested; Victim Stable – On Monday, April 11, at about 7:15 p.m., Oakland Police officers responded to the 7700 block of MacArthur Boulevard a report of a shooting. Officers located the victim, who had been shot. The victim was transported to a local hospital, where he was listed in stable condition. The suspect was arrested in connection with the shooting and a gun was recovered.

May 2016

Police Receive Tip, Arrest Armed Robbery Suspect – On Monday, May 30, 2016, at about 7:45 PM, a person who had been robbed at knife-point two days earlier called the police to report that he saw one of the robbery suspects. Officers were directed to the suspect's location in the 5100 block of International Boulevard, where an arrest was made.

Robbery Suspect Arrested, Loss Recovered – On Tuesday, May 31, 2016, at about 7:40 PM, Oakland Police officers responded to the 1900 block of 10th Avenue on a report of a robbery. Upon arrival, the officers located one of the robbery suspects. They arrested the suspect and recovered the loss.

Four Armed Robbery Suspects Arrested – On Saturday, May 28, 2016, at 10:30 PM, Oakland Police officers responded to the 9800 block of MacArthur Boulevard on a report of an armed robbery. Upon arrival, the officers obtained descriptions of the suspect and the vehicle used. Later, patrol officers located the vehicle and the suspects. A pursuit ensued and at the termination of the pursuit, four suspects were arrested.

June 2016

Attempted Armed Robbery Suspect Arrested – On Thursday, June 30, 2016, at about 6:55 PM, Oakland Police officers were flagged down in the 2500 block of Foothill Boulevard by a man who told them he had just been assaulted in an attempted robbery. The victim pointed down the road, where the suspect had fled. The officers saw the suspect get into a vehicle and they followed it. When they made a traffic stop, the suspect got out of the car and ran. The officers pursued the suspect on foot and arrested him. They also recovered a firearm.

Arrests Made in Home Invasion Robbery – On Wednesday, June 29, 2016, at 11:22 PM, a home invasion robbery occurred in the 4700 block of Fair Avenue. Two men forced their way into a residence and demanded money, threatening one of the residents at gunpoint. OPD officers arrived on scene and were able to detain and arrest the suspects. Two firearms were recovered.

Carjacking Suspect Arrested Within Days – On Monday, June 27, 2016, at about 7:00 PM, a carjacking occurred in the 7200 block of International Boulevard. The victims advised that an unknown man had pointed a firearm at them, forced them out of their vehicle, and taken it. Three days later, at approximately 2:20 PM, OPD patrol officers observed the stolen vehicle in the 8700 block of B Street. They made contact and arrested the driver, an adult male, for the carjacking and for possession of stolen property.

Officers Make Arrest for Attempted Armed Robbery – On Sunday, June 26, 2016, at about 2:30 PM, Oakland Police officers responded to a call of an attempted armed robbery in a business in the 4400 block of MacArthur Boulevard. As they arrived on scene, officers observed the suspect attempt to rob a person outside the business. They pursued the suspect and were able to take him into custody in the 2900 block of Foothill Boulevard. The weapon was a replica firearm.

Burglar Arrested; Loss Returned to Victim – On Saturday, June 25, 2016, at about 10:00 AM, Oakland Police officers responded to a call of burglary in the 1300 block of San Luis Avenue. The suspect used a gardening tool to threaten the homeowner, and fled with several valuables. The suspect was later taken into custody in a neighboring city and

then placed under arrest by Oakland Police officers. The loss was recovered and returned to the victim.

Four Arrested for Armed Robbery – On Tuesday, June 21, 2016, at about 11:10 PM, an Oakland Police officer responded to a call of an armed robbery which had just occurred in the 3800 block of E. 12th Street. The victims were able to provide a detailed description of the robbers and the vehicle they used to flee the scene. Minutes after the officer broadcast the crime over his radio, a second officer spotted the suspect vehicle and was able to pull it over. The four male occupants, three teens and an adult, were arrested for the armed robbery.

Robbery and Assault with a Firearm - On Friday, June 17, 2016, at about 10:17 AM, Oakland Police officers responded to a report of a shooting in the 1100 block of 63rd Street. The officers were able to provide aid to the victim until the emergency medical team arrived. Officers determined that an attempted armed robbery had culminated in a shooting. Later that day, they were able to locate the suspect and make an arrest for the robbery.

Assault with a Stun Gun/Taser and Attempted Carjacking - On Thursday, June 16, 2016, at about 9:44 AM, Oakland Police officers responded to a call of a suspect armed with a knife trying to rob someone in the 1700 block of MacArthur Boulevard. When the officers arrived, the suspect had fled. As they canvassed the area, they located the suspect and made the arrest for attempted robbery.

Shots Fired; Three Arrested – On Saturday, June 11, 2016, at about 11:35 PM, Oakland Police officers responded to a report of shots fired in the 1400 block of 40th Avenue. When they arrived, they saw a single victim. A description of the suspect vehicle was broadcasted and officers were able to locate the vehicle at 70th Avenue and Weld Street. The three occupants were detained, arrested and a firearm was recovered from the suspect vehicle.

Officers Arrest One for Grand Theft Robbery; Loss Returned to Victim – On Friday, June 10, 2016, at about 10:30 PM, Oakland Police officers responded to a call of grand theft robbery in the 800 block of Oak Street. The suspect had fled on foot with the loss.

Arriving officers were directed to the suspect, who was arrested. The loss was recovered and returned.

Two Burglary Suspects Arrested in Possession of Illegal Firearms – On Friday, June 10, 2016, at about 5:00 AM, Oakland Police officers responded to an in-progress burglary in the 4900 block of San Leandro Street. The two suspects, who had fled on foot, were located and arrested, and two illegally possessed firearms were recovered.

Kidnapping/65th & Herzog Streets; Victims Rescued – On Wednesday, June 8, 2016, at 9:14 AM, the Oakland Police Department (OPD) received a call of a possible kidnapping in the 1000 block of 65th Street. The caller advised that a man had just taken a woman. Oakland police officers responded to the area and conducted a preliminary investigation. Officers spoke with and gathered information from several witnesses in the area. Information obtained led the investigation to a residence in the area of Herzog Street and 65th Street. Officers established a perimeter around the residence. During the preliminary investigation, the victim, a female teenager, was safely located and advised the officers that she had been kidnapped. Soon after, the suspect, a male in his 20s, was located, identified and safely taken into custody. Currently, three young girls have been rescued and two arrests have been made. OPD Special Victims Section – Vice/Child Exploitation Unit investigators believe the incident is connected to human sex trafficking. Investigators have confirmed that three young girls, ages 14, 15 and 16, were rescued by police officers at the residence in the 1000 block of 65th Street where two suspects were arrested. The suspects are a 21-year-old male and a 22-year-old female from Oakland. This investigation is still on-going; anyone with information is asked to call the Special Victims Section at (510) 238-3641.

July 2016

Three Arrested for Attempted Robbery – On Thursday, July 21, 2016 at about 7:50 PM , Oakland Police officers on patrol in the 2600 block of Foothill Boulevard were flagged down by two men who said they had just fled from three males who had attempted to rob them. The officers were able to detain and arrest all three suspects for attempted strong arm robbery.

Two Arrested in Connection with Illegal Possession of Handgun – On Monday, July 18, 2016, at about 3:15 AM, Oakland Police officers on patrol observed a stopped vehicle in the middle of the roadway near the intersection of 9th Street and Martin Luther King, Jr. Way. Two men appeared to be sleeping inside the car. When the officers approached the car, they observed a handgun in the driver’s lap. The officers were able to recover the firearm as well as narcotics and drug paraphernalia. The two suspects were arrested.

Two Arrested for Stolen Vehicle – On Monday, July 18, 2016, at about 3:39 PM, Oakland Police officers observed a car that appeared to match the description of a vehicle that had been used in a robbery. When the officers attempted to conduct a vehicle stop, a short pursuit ensued and eventually an adult and a juvenile suspect were safely taken into custody. Further investigation indicates that both suspects may also have been involved in a residential burglary.

Witness Description Leads to Arrest – On Sunday, July 17, 2016 at approximately 9:42 AM, Oakland Police officers responded to the intersection of Lakeshore Avenue and MacArthur Boulevard in response to a reported strong arm robbery. Witnesses provided descriptions of the suspects and the suspect vehicle. At around 7:30 PM, officers located a vehicle that appeared to match the description of the suspect vehicle, and were able to arrest the driver.

Two Arrested for Illegally Possessed Handguns – On Saturday, July 16, 2016, at about 8:00 PM, Oakland Police officers were flagged down in the 1000 block of 7th Street by apartment security guards who had detained two men armed with handguns. The officers recovered two illegally possessed handguns, one from each of the suspects, and placed them under arrest.

OPD Officers Arrest Suspect for Carjacking – On July 11, 2016, at about 1:17 AM, Oakland Police officers responded to the 2200 block of E. 12th Street on a call of an armed carjacking. Later that evening, at about 10:07 PM, an officer spotted the stolen vehicle and attempted to conduct a traffic stop. A short pursuit ensued. The suspect vehicle collided with parked vehicles in the 2500 block of 62nd Avenue. Officers were able to arrest one suspect.

August 2016

Homicides Solved: Arrests Made in Recent Cases, DA Charges

- **Arturo Hector Barrera Rodriquez** - The Oakland Police Department has arrested an 18-year-old Oakland man for the homicide of Oakland resident Arturo Hector Barrera Rodriquez, 43. The Alameda County District Attorney's Office has charged Danny Sakeem Hogg of Oakland with the murder of Rodriquez, which occurred on the evening of June 9, 2016. **BACKGROUND:** On June 9, 2016, at approximately 10:10 p.m., Oakland police officers responded to a shooting in the 2800 block of 38th Avenue. Emergency personnel arrived on scene and provided first aid, but the victim was pronounced deceased.
- **Marcus West, Jr.** - The Oakland Police Department has arrested a 24-year-old Hayward man for the homicide of Oakland resident Marcus West, Jr., 22. The Alameda County District Attorney's Office has charged DeShawn Christy with the murder of West, which occurred on the morning of March 3, 2015. **BACKGROUND:** On March 3, 2015, at approximately 7:03 a.m., Oakland police officers responded to a shooting in the 4700 block of Scotia Avenue. When officers arrived on scene, they located the victim suffering from multiple gunshot wounds. Emergency personnel provided first aid, but he was pronounced deceased at the scene.
- **Javiya Evans** - The Oakland Police Department has arrested an 18-year-old Oakland man for the homicide of 20-year-old Javiya Evans of Oakland. The Alameda County District Attorney's Office has charged Shermon Freemon with the murder of Evans, which occurred on the morning of June 23, 2016. **BACKGROUND:** On June 23, 2016, at approximately 8:14 a.m., Oakland police officers responded to a shooting in the 6300 block of Baker Street. Officers located the victim suffering from multiple gunshot wounds. The victim was transported to a local hospital where he succumbed to his injuries.

DA Charges Oakland Man With Attempted Murder - On Monday, August 1, 2016, the Alameda County District Attorney's Office charged Marcus Moss, 30, of Oakland, with attempted murder of Oakland Police Sergeant Nadia Clark. Just before 9:30 p.m.,

Saturday, July 23, Sergeant Nadia Clark was responding to a call for service when her patrol vehicle was involved in a collision in the 1900 block of 73rd Avenue. Shortly after the collision, Moss approached the sergeant's vehicle and fired a round, striking the vehicle. The sergeant, who was not struck by the gunfire, was taken to a local hospital and treated for injuries related to the vehicle accident. Investigators determined that Moss's actions were separate and not related to the collision. On July 28, just before 4:30 a.m., Stockton Police Department's SWAT team made entry into a residence and assisted OPD in arresting Moss. Investigators recovered evidence, including a firearm. OPD would like to thank the Stockton Police Department for their assistance.

Three Suspects Captured After Home Break-In - On Tuesday, August 2, 2016, at approximately 1:38 p.m., officers responded to the 3600 block of Kingsley Street after receiving a call from a young girl who reportedly heard noises of an apparent break-in at the residence. Three suspects forced their way into the residence. A loss was reported. Arriving officers observed the three suspects exiting the residence. They were immediately arrested. No injuries were reported.

Four Robbers Arrested After Vehicle Pursuit - On Wednesday, August 3, 2016, at approximately 8:10 a.m., officers responded to the area of Jean Street and Santa Clara Avenue on a report of an armed robbery. When officers arrived on scene, witnesses directed officers to a suspect vehicle fleeing the area. A pursuit ensued and terminated in the area of Fruitvale Avenue and East 10th Street. At this time, officers have arrested four people. Investigators believe the suspects may be connected to multiple armed robberies. Several victims were transported to a local hospital for medical treatment. A firearm was recovered and there were losses from multiple victims.

K-9, Helicopter Aid OPD In Vehicle Pursuit - On Wednesday, August 3, 2016 at approximately 5:30 p.m., officers responded to the 3400 block of East 16th Street on a report of a strong armed robbery. The victim told the officers while she was walking, she was approached by three suspects who forced her to the ground and took her cell phone. The suspects fled on foot. A witness directed officers to a nearby residence where they gathered more information and located the loss. Following up with investigative information, a short time later, two of the three suspects were arrested near the intersection of Havenscourt Boulevard and Bancroft Avenue. The third suspect remains at large.

DUI/ Driver's License Checkpoint Planned in Oakland - Designate a sober driver or call a cab or other transportation options. DON'T DRINK AND DRIVE - Today, August 5, 2016, the Oakland Police Department Traffic Operations Section will be conducting a DUI/ Driver's License checkpoint at an undisclosed location within the city limits between the hours of 7:00 p.m. to 2:00 a.m. The deterrent effect of DUI checkpoints is a proven resource in reducing the number of persons killed and injured in alcohol or drug involved crashes. Research shows that crashes involving an impaired driver can be reduced by up to 20 percent, when well-publicized DUI checkpoints and proactive DUI patrols are conducted routinely [more...](#)

Arrest Made in Double Homicide and Attempted Homicide -

The Oakland Police Department has arrested Francisco Jesus Hernandez, 37, of Oakland, in connection with a double homicide and an attempted homicide which occurred on August 8, 2016 at 1:46 AM, in the 9900 block of Empire Road. Two male victims suffered fatal gunshot wounds and the third male victim was critically wounded. Hernandez was arrested on Monday, August 8, 2016.



The Alameda County District Attorney's Office charged Hernandez for two counts of murder, attempted murder, and arson on August 10, 2016. At this time, Oakland police are awaiting the Alameda County Coroner's Office to positively identify the two homicide victims. **BACKGROUND:** On August 8, 2016, at 1:46 AM, Oakland police officers responded to a reporting of a shooting in the 9900 block of Empire Road. When officers arrived at the scene, they located three victims suffering from multiple gunshot wounds. Emergency medical personnel responded to the scene to provide aid to the victims. The third victim was hospitalized and is expected to recover from his injuries.

Suspect Arrested & Charged in Home Invasion and Sexual Assault - On August 12, 2016, Oakland Police officers arrested Clyde Dell Anderson, 26, in connection with the home invasion and sexual assault that occurred on August 12, 2016, in the 6500 block of Fenham Street. Anderson, 26, was charged this week by the Alameda County District Attorney's Office for assault with intent to commit a sex crime and for first degree residential burglary. **BACKGROUND:** On Friday, August 12, 2016 at 4:18 a.m., Oakland

police officers were alerted by neighbors of a woman screaming for help in the 6500 block of Fenham Street. Officers quickly discovered the suspect had made his way into the residence where he physically and sexually assaulted the victim. The victim was transported to a local hospital where she was treated for injuries. Investigators have determined that at this time it does not appear that the suspect and victim are known to each other.

Officers Arrest Suspect in Armed Robbery; Recover Gun and Loss – On August 13, 2016, at 1:00 a.m., Oakland police officers responded to the 1600 block of 28th Street to investigate a report of an armed robbery. When officers arrived, they contacted the victims, who reported they had been robbed at gunpoint. The preliminary investigation led officers to a residence in the 700 block of 17th Street, where they located and arrested the suspect. Officers additionally recovered a firearm and the victims' loss.

Second Suspect (Son) Arrested and Charged in Connection with Double Homicide and Attempted Murder - On Thursday, August 11, 2016, the Oakland Police Department arrested a 17-year-old Hayward teen in connection with a double homicide and attempted murder which occurred on August 8, 2016 in the 9900 block of Empire Road. On Monday, August 15, Francisco Hernandez was charged with two counts of special circumstances murder, one count of attempted murder and one count of arson, causing great bodily injury. Hernandez, who has been charged as an adult, was arrested in the Central Valley. His father, Francisco Jesus Hernandez, 37, of Hayward, is facing identical charges. He was charged by the Alameda County District Attorney's Office on August 10, 2016. At this time, Oakland police are awaiting the Alameda County Coroner's Office to positively identify the victims. **BACKGROUND:** On August 8, 2016, at 1:46 a.m., the Oakland Police Department Communications Section received a call from a citizen reporting a shooting in the 9900 block of Empire Road. When officers arrived at the scene, they located three victims suffering from multiple gunshot wounds. Emergency medical personnel responded to the scene to provide aid to the victims. A third victim was hospitalized and was expected to recover from his injuries. The elder Hernandez was arrested in Hayward later that day.

Citizen Directs Officers to an Auto Burglary in Progress – On August 16, 2016 at 5:30 a.m., officers responded to the 2900 block of East 22nd Street on a report of an auto

burglary in progress. Officers contacted the victim, who was able to direct them to the suspects. Officers arrested both suspects.

Suspect Arrested in Connection with Stabbing – On August 16, 2016 at 1:45 a.m., Oakland police officers responded to the 400 block of West MacArthur Boulevard on a report of a stabbing. When officers arrived, they found an adult male victim suffering from a stab wound. The victim was transported to a local hospital and is listed in stable condition at this time. The suspect returned to the scene and was subsequently taken into custody.

Three Juveniles Arrested for Involvement in Multiple Robberies, Carjackings - On August 20, 2016 at 5:10 p.m., Oakland Police officers arrested three suspects near the intersection of Wisconsin Street and Brown Avenue in connection with multiple strong armed robberies and several attempted carjackings throughout the City.

Robbery and Theft Suspects Arrested - On August 22, 2016 at 4:40 p.m., Oakland Police officers detained a vehicle and arrested two male occupants in connection with multiple strong armed robberies and thefts of businesses throughout Oakland as well as one in the city of Alameda.

Helicopter Aids Officers in Suspect Arrests - On August 23, 2016 at 2:05 p.m., Oakland Police officers observed a vehicle reportedly involved in a robbery near the intersection of 89th Avenue and G Streets and attempted to stop the vehicle. The vehicle did not yield. Argus, the OPD helicopter, assisted ground units with the direction and location the suspect vehicle was fleeing. Eventually the vehicle stopped and the driver was taken into custody. Later, three additional suspects, who were believed to be involved with the robbery, were also arrested.

OPD Officer Leads County-Wide Investigation – On Thursday, August 25, Oakland Police officer Crabtree played a major role in the culmination of a two-year investigation that shut down a local chop shop and ended with the arrest of 35-year-old Oakland resident Albert Murry. Officer Crabtree is part of the ACRAATT (Alameda County Regional Auto Theft Task Force). Hundreds of stolen vehicles and components were recovered.

Arrests Made in Early-Morning Home Invasion and Assault - On Tuesday, August 30, 2016 at 2:39 a.m., Oakland Police officers arrested two individuals in connection with a home invasion and assault in the 4600 block of Sequoyah Road. Both victims, one in his 70s and the other in his 80s, were physically assaulted. One of the victims sustained moderate injuries and was transported to a local hospital and has since been released. The second victim had minor injuries and was medically treated at the scene. The investigation revealed that three male suspects forced their way into the residence.

September 2016

Oakland Man Arrested, Charged In Homicide Earlier This Year – On September 30, Oakland Police officers arrested Patrick Dempsey and the Alameda County District Attorney’s Office charged him on Tuesday, October 4 for the murder of Spencer Reboredo, 27, of Oakland. BACKGROUND: On July 14, 2016 at 4:17 a.m., officers responded to the 900 block of 35th Street on a report of a shooting. Officers discovered Reboredo suffering from fatal gunshot wounds. Investigators determined Reboredo and Dempsey were acquaintances and that a dispute occurred over a vehicle.

Officers Arrest Man Involved In Hammer Attack - On September 20, 2016 at 1:00 p.m., Oakland Police officers responded to the 3900 block of Martin Luther King Jr. Way on a report of an assault with a deadly weapon and attempted robbery. Officers found a male victim who was involved in an altercation with another male, who attempted to hit the victim with a hammer. The suspect fled on 40th Street and was eventually arrested.

Passing Citizen Helps Victim Fight Off Suspect - On September 20, 2016 at 11:30 a.m., Oakland Police officers responded to the 1400 block of 82nd Avenue on a report of an attempted robbery. Officers contacted a female victim who said a female subject approached her from behind and threatened her with a knife. She began screaming and was assisted by a passing citizen who came to her aid. The suspect fled the scene on foot, but officers detained and then arrested the suspect.

Alert Officers Capture Suspect Linked To Multiple Crimes - In the evening of September 19, 2016, Oakland Police officers responded to a series of armed robberies and an attempted kidnapping in East Oakland, all involving the same suspect as well as an additional robbery in neighboring San Leandro. Later in the day, officers located the suspect vehicle, and after a brief foot pursuit, detained a subject who had fled from officers. The suspect was subsequently positively identified by all of the victims and the loss from the robberies was located inside a vehicle. A loaded semi-automatic pistol was also recovered. The suspect eventually surrendered to police without incident about 4:05 p.m. BACKGROUND: On Monday, October 24, at 9:40 p.m., in the 2500 block of 35th Avenue, while officers were on scene investigating this shooting, just after midnight, a suspected drunk driver crashed into five parked vehicles, three of them Oakland police vehicles. One of the five passengers died as the result of the accident.

Homicide suspect charged - On Friday, October 21, 2016, Honorio Hernandez-Meza, 27, of Woodland, was charged by the Alameda County District Attorney's Office in connection with the murder of Alberto Juarez. BACKGROUND: On July 24, 2016 at 1:15 a.m., Oakland police officers responded to the 9200 block of Holly Street to investigate a report of a shooting. Juarez was attempting to stop an altercation involving others when he was fatally shot. Three others were wounded.

Two suspects arrested in robbery, replica firearm recovered - On Tuesday, October 25, 2016 at 5:11 p.m., Oakland police patrol officers recognized multiple subjects in the 7700 block of Bancroft Avenue who matched the description of suspects identified in a robbery from the previous day. Arrest made in triple homicide; DA charges case – On Tuesday, November 15, 2016 the Alameda County District Attorney’s Office charged Dana Rivers in connection with the homicide of three people which occurred on November 11, 2016 at 12:21 a.m., in the 9400 block of Dunbar Drive. Rivers was charged with three counts of murder, one count of arson of an inhabited dwelling and possession of metal knuckles.

BACKGROUND: On Friday, November 11, 2016 at 12:21 a.m., Oakland police officers were dispatched to the 9400 block of Dunbar Drive to investigate a report of a shooting. When officers arrived on scene, they located three victims, who suffered fatal gunshots and stab wounds. During the preliminary investigation, officers and investigators determined that the suspect, Dana Rivers, 61, of San Jose, was responsible for the triple homicide. She was arrested later that morning. Investigators additionally learned that Rivers attempted to set fire to the residence, but the Oakland Fire Department was able to quickly extinguish the fire. The victims of this triple homicide were identified as Charlotte Reed, 55, Toto Diambu, 19, and Patricia Wright, 57. All were Oakland residents.

Oakland, Piedmont and BART police team up to make arrests in North Oakland robberies – On Monday, November 14, 2016, just after 8:00 p.m., Oakland police officers, in conjunction with the Piedmont and BART police, assisted in the arrest of multiple female suspects wanted in connection with numerous robberies in and around the North Oakland area. The vehicle being driven by the suspects was reported stolen and is believed to be the car used in multiple robberies. Officers additionally located evidence/loss from the robbery victims.

Officers arrested robbery suspect without incident – On Monday, November 14, 2016 at 3:50 p.m., Oakland police officers responded to the 2100 block of Telegraph Avenue on a report of a strong armed robbery. When officers arrived on scene, a witness directed the officers to the suspect’s location. Officers were able to safely arrest the suspect.

Officers locate stolen vehicle, arrest carjacking suspect – On Friday, November 11, 2016 at 9:40 p.m., Oakland police officers responded to the 5300 block of Ygnacio Avenue on a report of an armed robbery and carjacking. Additionally, Simpson was charged with one count of possession of a firearm by a felon. Riley is also facing an additional firearms related charge.

BACKGROUND: On Saturday, November 5, 2016 just after 12:00 a.m., Oakland police officers responded to the 400 block of 14th Street on a report of multiple shots fired. Officers were in the area and heard the shots. When officers arrived on scene, eight people had been shot, two were suspects and six were victims; four females and two males, ages ranging from 17-28. They were transported to local hospitals and some victims self-initiated transport to local hospitals. At this time, it appears the shooting took place outside of a business.

Two arrested, charged in homicide – On Monday, November 7, 2016, the Alameda County District Attorney’s Office filed charges against Laura Louise Rodgers and Curtys Taylor in connection with the homicide of 21-year-old San Leandro resident Karla Ramirez-Segoviano.

BACKGROUND: On November 2, 2016, the Alameda County Sheriff’s Office filed a missing person’s report regarding the whereabouts of Ramirez-Segoviano, a former Alameda County Sheriff’s Office Explorer, who wanted to pursue a career in law enforcement. The next day, Oakland police officers responded to the 7700 block of Krause Avenue at 11:59 a.m. on a report of an unresponsive female. It was determined the female was deceased and a victim of a homicide. On Friday, November 4, 2016, the Alameda County Coroner’s Bureau positively identified the victim as Karla Ramirez-Segoviano.
