OAKLAND POLICE ARREST HOMICIDE SUSPECTS; DISTRICT ATTORNEY CHARGES – On August 31, 2017, the Oakland Police Department arrested Dorsey Howard, 26 of Oakland, and Zuberi Steel, 29 of Oakland, for the murder of Joachim Hanwright, 46 of San Francisco. Hanwright was murdered on August 24, 2017, at 12:27 p.m. in the 1700 block of 7th Street.

On September 5, 2017, the Alameda County District Attorney's Office charged Howard and Steel with the murder of Hanwright, with special circumstances during commission of robbery.



OPD AND MULTIPLE AGENCIES CONDUCTING MORNING INVESTIGATIONS ON INDIVIDUALS ASSOCIATED WITH GANGS AND VIOLENT CRIMES - At this time, we can advise that at least nine arrests have been made and a number of firearms have been recovered as a result of this morning's investigation. Each arrested individual had a criminal arrest warrant issued for them prior to this morning's operation. The warrants were served in Oakland and additional cities. No injuries have been reported associated to this morning's investigation.

This investigation identified individuals involved in criminal activity, which include murder, conspiracy to commit murder, shootings, robberies, home burglaries and gun possession. The department's strategy in identifying these individuals was based on data collection and intelligence driven information.

Additional detailed information will be provided by the OPD Media Unit after the Alameda County District Attorney's Office has had an opportunity to review and charge each individual case.

POLICE REQUESTING COMMUNITY ASSISTANCE IN UNSOLVED HOMICIDES – The Oakland Police Department is requesting the public's assistance in helping us to solve the homicides of Terrence McCrary, Jr., 22, and Craig Fletcher-Cooks, 20. We know there were hundreds of people at the location where the shooting occurred. We believe someone saw the suspects responsible for the shooting. At this time, we would like to speak to anyone who has information pertaining to this incident, no matter how insignificant it may seem.

A little over a year ago, at 12:53 a.m. on August 14, 2016, McCrary Jr. and Fletcher-Cooks were shot and killed, while attending a block party in the 300 block of 15th Street in Oakland.

Fletcher-Cooks was with his girlfriend when a group of suspects in their 20's grabbed her. When Fletcher-Cooks stepped in to defend his girlfriend, he was physically assaulted by a group of males. During this altercation, Fletcher-Cooks was shot and killed.

At the time of the incident, it was estimated there were approximately 300 people were on block, located between Harrison Street and Webster Street. As the initial gunshots began, the large crowd began running in all directions. As a result of the shooting, 22-year-old Terrence McCrary Jr. was struck by a stray bullet. He was pronounced deceased at the scene. There was a third victim, a 24-year-old male, who was shot several times but survived his injuries.

The tragic loss of McCrary Jr. and Fletcher-Cooks leaves both families and the community with a loss. The Department and the family want to identify and locate those responsible for this crime and bring closure to the families and community.

The McCrary Family shared, "Terrence was a thoughtful, warm, loving son, brother, and friend. He was a talented skateboarder and aspiring artist. His death leaves a void in the lives of his family, friends and artist community."

Police and Crime Stoppers of Oakland are offering a \$25,000 reward for information leading to an arrest.

700-27th Street-Homeland Security Investigations (HSI) served a federal criminal search warrant

Today, August 16, 2017, at approximately 6:30 a.m., Homeland Security Investigations (HSI) served a federal criminal search warrant in connection with human trafficking of juveniles in our city (700 block of 27th Street).

HSI is conducting a criminal investigation, not a civil immigration or deportation action. This branch focuses on Transnational Gangs, Human Trafficking, Human Smuggling, Child Exploitation and Narcotic Enforcement.

Yesterday, HSI headquarters in San Francisco contacted Oakland Police Chief Anne E. Kirkpatrick and requested two police officers to assist with traffic control. Chief Kirkpatrick gave strict instructions to the commander and officers that they may not assist HSI with any enforcement efforts. The officers' only role was that of traffic control and neighborhood safety.

Although the Oakland Police Department no longer has a contract (MOU) to actively participate in investigations with HSI, the Department may assist our local, state, and federal agencies when requested as it pertains to traffic control, community safety and officer safety.

HSI is the primary investigating agency.


"National Night Out is an opportunity for people to help support police-community partnerships and raise crime prevention awareness in their neighborhood by having residents get to know each other through events like barbecues or ice cream socials," said Libby Schaaf. It's these connections that build communities block-by-block. This is important because the best crime prevention tool ever invented is a good neighbor."

National Night Out empowers people and provides an opportunity for communities to heal and foster peace in our neighborhoods. A powerful and profound message is "When neighbors know each other, neighborhoods are safer."

The City not only encourages neighbors to have a block party, but also to start a Neighborhood Watch Group on their street and to participate in their Neighborhood Crime Prevention Council where they can work in partnership with the City's Neighborhood Service Coordinators and the Community Resource Officers assigned to their neighborhood.

The Oakland A's donated 1200 baseball tickets for party hosts to show their appreciation for stepping up and providing leadership on their block.

Throughout Oakland, from east to west, north to south, more people than ever before are coming out to make their neighborhood safer and stronger.
