Oakland, CA – This week, **Oakland Public Works** participates with thousands of other organizations across North America in honoring the 56th annual **National Public Works Week**. The purpose of the celebration is to energize and inform the public of the important contributions of the Public Works Department to their daily lives, including – cleaning and greening our shared environment; providing zero waste services; improving our roadways and streetscapes to ensure safe and accessible transportation options for pedestrians, bicyclists, transit and vehicles; designing, constructing and maintaining City-owned facilities including all fire stations, libraries, recreation and senior centers; providing vehicles for police and fire; keeping traffic signals and street lights on; ensuring our facilities flush and drain as they are meant to do; and dealing with blight in our neighborhoods including illegal dumping and graffiti – all fundamental to our shared quality of life. This year’s national association’s theme says it all – **Public Works Always There!**

Oakland Public Works maintains, plans and builds Oakland’s physical and natural infrastructure including parks, streets, sewers, storm drains, street lights and buildings.
