**Oakland Creek to Bay Day Volunteers**

**Clean and Green Oakland – Saturday, September 17, 2016**

Oakland, CA – Hundreds of Oaklanders are expected to participate in the largest volunteer day in the world. On Saturday, September 17, they will celebrate the 21<sup>st</sup> Annual Oakland Creek to Bay Day, part of [California](#) and [International Coastal Cleanup Day](#). Thousands of volunteers will clean trash from shorelines and waterways across California, the nation and in about 100 countries. In Oakland, volunteers will remove trash and invasive plants from creeks, parks, shorelines and streets at approximately 40 locations.

These local activities have large-scale environmental impacts. Habitat restoration and litter removal at Oakland’s 15 creeks improves wildlife habitat and helps filter pollutants *before* they reach the San Francisco Bay. Keeping trash out of streets and waterways also helps prevent flooding during rain storms by allowing storm water to flow through unobstructed storm drains. Oakland Creek to Bay Day raises awareness about sources of water pollution, and is a fun, community-building event for participants of all ages and abilities.

In 2015, approximately 1,200 Oakland Creek to Bay Day volunteers removed 16,000 pounds of trash and 150 cubic yards of invasive plants from Oakland’s creeks, parks, shoreline and streets. Worldwide, 68,000 volunteers prevented 1,142,997 pounds of trash from entering inland waterways and oceans. Organizers anticipate an even more successful event in 2016.
